Anti-Bullying Policy (Child-Friendly Version)

What is bullying?

In our school a bully is someone who hurts someone on purpose more than once, using behaviour that is meant to hurt, frighten or upset another person.

Bullying can be.....

Emotional: Hurting your feelings, leaving you out, making you feel bad

Physical: Punching, kicking, pushing, stealing

Verbal: Teasing, name-calling, being rude, racist and homophobic comments, cyber bullying

If you are bullied:

DO

- ✓ Ask the bully to stop if you can
- ✓ Tell the bully you don't like it if you can
- ✓ Walk away
- ✓ **TELL SOMEONE!**

DON'T

- ✗ Do what they say
- ✗ Get angry
- ✗ Hit them
- ✗ Think that it is your fault
- ✗ Hide it

What should I do if I see someone else being bullied?

- ✓ Don't ignore it
- ✓ Tell the bully to stop if you can
- ✓ **TELL SOMEONE**
