### Reporting to parents:

The Government has removed the legal requirement to report Reception and Year 2 data due to the Lockdown. We are still having conversations about pupil progress but obviously this makes it very difficult to report with accuracy—particularly when predicting the end of year attainment.

We will still send out reports (Y1-Y5)regarding each child's progress and efforts in school. We will still provide you with an estimated grade for end of year achievement, taking into account how your child was progressing **before** the closure and had they continued to achieve at their own pace throughout the year. This is not ideal but we felt that parents would want to read their child's report—even if the grade is not entirely accurate in the long run.

Reception children usually receive a very detailed account of progress towards the Early learning Goals. will receive a slimmed down version of the normal report—school has taken government advice with regards to this and has designed their own template...



The weather has been kind to us over the last few weeks so I hope you have been able to enjoy some activities outside.




