Explain the main idea of John Bowlby's attachment theory?

Identify three types of behaviour a baby would display (social releaser) to seek closeness (proximity) to their main caregiver and to receive care and comfort?

Give three conditions that seem to threaten the achievement of proximity (closeness) between the infant and the main caregiver?

Explain why a strong bond of attachment is important to the development of the infant?

One of the main factors in developing a bond of attachment is not food but care and responsiveness from the main caregiver.

Can you identify three activities during the infant's daily routine which may promote bonding between the infant and the caregiver (other than feeding)?
