Prayerful Reflection – 11th February 2026

Road Safety

We would like to remind all parents and carers of the vital importance of road safety, especially during the busy drop-off and pick-up times.

Recently, we have seen an increase in unsafe behaviour around the school site, including children crossing without looking carefully, stepping out between parked cars, and riding scooters or bikes without paying attention to vehicles or pedestrians.

We have spoken with all pupils about how to keep themselves safe, but these messages are far more effective when reinforced at home.

It is equally important that adults model safe and considerate behaviour. Please ensure that you park and drive responsibly when near the school. This includes not stopping on zig-zag lines, not parking on double yellow lines, and avoiding blocking residents' driveways.

These restrictions are in place to protect children's visibility, maintain safe crossing points, and ensure emergency access if needed. When cars are parked illegally or inconsiderately, it creates hazards for everyone and increases the risk of accidents.

Your support in promoting safe habits—both for children and adults—helps create a safer environment for the whole school community.
