Summer Safety

As we move into the lighter evenings, many of our children naturally begin to enjoy a little more independence when playing outside or travelling to and from school. This is an exciting time of year for them, and we understand the growing responsibility that comes with this increased freedom.

To help keep everyone safe, we kindly ask for your support in reminding your children about key safety messages:

Stranger awareness:

Please encourage your children to stay alert when they are out and about, and to always report anything that makes them feel unsure or uncomfortable.

Road safety:

With brighter evenings, it can be easy for children to become less cautious, especially when they are in groups or feeling more confident. Please speak with them about crossing roads safely, staying visible, and being aware of their surroundings.

Mobile phone awareness:

A number of our pupils now have their own phones. We are increasingly noticing that some children are distracted by their devices when walking, particularly near roads. Please remind them to put phones away when crossing or approaching traffic.
