# Art Drawing & Self Portrait

### Knowledge I already know

l know the basic proportions of the face: oval shape, general proportions, detailed understanding of the eyes and mouth (position and formation).

I know that the pencil's grade describes how soft the lead is (extending my knowledge to 5B and 2H.

I know that artists use a wide range of techniques to create tone, form and texture, including shading, stippling, hatching, cross-hatching, random hatching and removing a media to create highlights.

#### Knowledge I will learn

I know that the edges of the nostrils line up with the tear ducts of the eyes.

I know that the pencil's grade describes how hard or soft the lead is, extending my knowledge to 6B

I know that lines can be used to create feeling and emotion in a composition (expressive line)

I know that monochrome is where a composition only uses different tones of a single colour.

I know that artists can use a wide range of techniques to create tone, form and texture (including contour shading, contour hatching and scumbling)

I know that some 2D artwork will have 3D texture created by the use of backgrounds.

I know that drawing media can be used together and overlapped for effect. This is called mixed media.

## Artist in focus—Frank Auerbach



He was Jewish and was evacuated from Berlin to England during WW2. Both of his parents died in concentration camps.

He used both charcoal and paint. In both media, his work is expressive and semi-abstract. In drawing, he uses lines and mark—making very expressively to create a disturbing atmosphere.

Expressionism	pressionism A style of art where the artist is trying to communicate emotion rather that create an accurate image of the world.					
Expressive line	Curved lines with lots of movement that follow less obvious paths. They often create movement, energy and emotion.					
Scumbling	A form of mark making with several definitions.  In drawing, scribble-like lines are overlapped to create texture and tone.					
Contour shading	shading Shading (creating light and dark using a pencil) where the movements of the pencil follow the contours (form) of the object.					
Contour hatching	A type of shading where hatching lines follow the contours (form) of the object.					
Monochrome	Only using different tones of a single hue. Often used to describe work which is grayscale.					
Mixed media	Where more than one media are used at the same time to create artwork. These may be overlapped for effect.					
Physical texture	The texture you would experience if you were to touch the artwork.
