Knowledge I already know

I know that Christians believe God is Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit and can explain the purpose of each part of the trinity.

I know that the Bible points out that Jesus' birth showed that He was extraordinary and that he came to bring good news.

I can use the term 'incarnation' and can talk about examples of how this theme has been explored in art and music by Christians.

Knowledge I will learn

I know that Jesus was Jewish and understand that 'Christ' is the Greek word for 'anointed one', or 'Messiah'.

Word	Definition
Christ	The Greek word for 'anointed one' or 'Messiah' when referring to Jesus Christ.
Messiah	In Old Testament prophecies - the anticipated deliverer of the Jews. In New Testament
Incarnate	The Christian belief that God became fully human in the form of Jesus Christ.
Gospels	Four books of the Bible which tell the story of the life of Jesus (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John)
Restoration	The act or repairing something (e.g. God's relationship with the world) returning to its original form.
