Jubilee year of St. Francis of Assisi

As we continue marking the Year of St Francis of Assisi, our school communities have been taking time to reflect on his message of simplicity, gratitude, and care for creation. Inspired by Pope Francis' *Laudato Si'*, pupils and staff have been looking closely at how small daily choices can help us live more lightly and responsibly.

Our work toward the LiveSimply Awards, has encouraged everyone to reduce waste, use resources thoughtfully, and build moments of stillness into the school day. These simple actions help us recognise the gifts God places in our lives and the responsibility we share to protect them.

Across the Trust, caring for creation has become part of our prayer life too. Whether tending garden spaces or learning about the environment in class, pupils are discovering that the world around us is something to honour, not just to use. Their charity work and fundraising have also deepened their understanding that caring for our common home includes caring for one another.

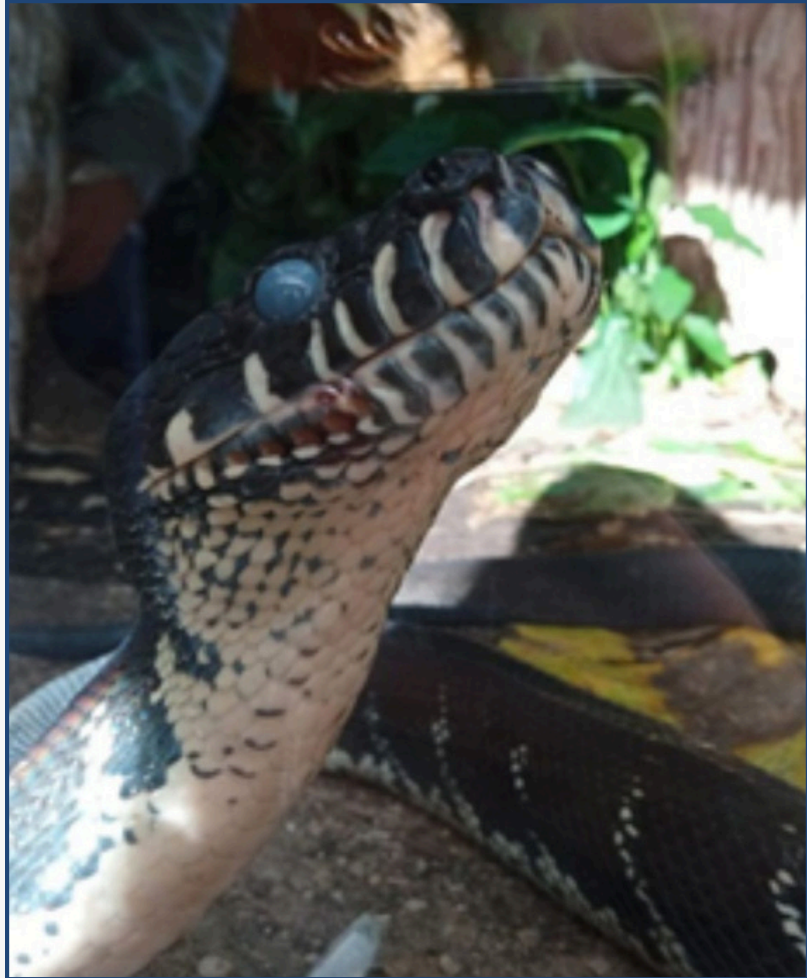
This year, Pope Leo has dedicated the Church's focus to St. Francis of Assisi, marking 800 years since his death. As the patron saint of animals, St. Francis reminds us of our shared responsibility for the natural world. To celebrate his legacy, members of our sixth form editorial team have written about how animals impact on, and inspire them.

Connecting through creatures: The impact of Zoology Club

Humans connect with animals all the time when we look at the world around us. We see examples with Koko the Gorilla, a gorilla who was taught sign language by her keepers and was able to connect with them.

St. Francis of Assisi connected with animals, the patron saint of animals and ecology, he was renowned for stories of communicating with creatures he called his brothers and sisters. Stories like these emphasise how animals help people develop empathy. Through connections with animals, we can feel empathised with, they know and can sense when we feel excited, worried, sad, upset and their mood can match and connect with us.

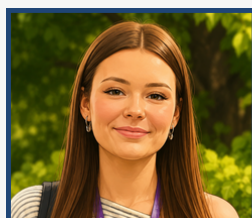
That is why **St. Joseph's Catholic Academy** implemented Zoology Club. At the club pupils are taught about various types of animals such as mammals, fish etc. The club organised a trip to Northumberland Zoo for students, where they interacted with animals, like axolotls, birds of prey and snakes.



Zoology Club had a great impact on the school community, it allows students to develop a love for animals and the world around them, just as St Francis of Assisi did with the animals around him. Year 12 student Orla said, *"Zoology Club was a great experience for me. It helped me to feel comfortable in school, meet new people and deepen my curiosity about the world."*

It also allowed pupils to develop their understanding of the scientific field of zoology, a passion that some may continue to pursue in later life. This enrichment activity has acted as a gateway for students to develop themselves both academically and socially. It built a community within the school, one that continues to have a significant impact on participants.

Elite sports facilities coming to St. Joseph's, Hebburn

Work began this year on the first steps in investment into sports facilities at **St. Joseph's Catholic Academy, Hebburn**. Working in partnership with external professionals at Martin Nugent Elite Performance, their strength and conditioning centre is being relocated to the school's campus. This state-of-the-art facility will be run by a team of accredited strength and conditioning coaches, who support a wide range of athletes. Out of hours school and the wider community will be able to use the facilities.

Martin Nugent, said, *"The new purpose-built facility will be the first of its kind in the UK, with a performance-based company working in collaboration with a school. It is a fantastic opportunity for pupils to train and work alongside elite-level athletes in a unique environment. We look forward to helping enhance the school and the wider Trust's sports provision. The facility will also include physiotherapy and nutritional guidance, to help educate pupils on the importance of an active, healthy lifestyle."*



The new build will include a high spec gym next to the school's sixth form block and will host dietitians, physiotherapists and top-quality gym equipment, with the intention to use the facility to promote healthy lifestyles among pupils.

Headteacher James Crowe says it will mark the start of a sporting hub at St. Joseph's, with plans already in place to install a 4G pitch, which is lower maintenance and will support improved performance. He also hopes that it will open doors for pupils and demonstrates school's investment in pupils day-to-day experiences.

The PE team are incredibly excited by this development, as it will provide motivation and allow for an expansion in the PE department. Other pupil groups will also benefit, the gardening club will be involved in landscaping the surrounding gardens and grass area once the build is complete. The top soil dug out for the foundations will be 'upcycled' into beautiful flower and plant areas for all to enjoy, while also increasing biodiversity.

Pupils are also happy with the investment, with one sixth former commenting that they were happy that "such a core part of the school's identity" was being invested in. One thing is for sure, it's an exciting time for sports enthusiasts at St Joseph's.

Update on St. Aidan's new building



We are delighted to share that **St. Aidan's Catholic Academy** redevelopment is progressing well, marking a new and exciting chapter for the entire school community.

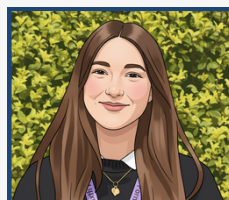
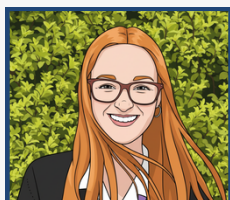
As of Spring 2026, the framework of the building is now clearly visible, offering a promising glimpse of what is to come. The next phase of the project will focus on removing the current teaching block to allow for a modernised sixth form centre, an upgraded sports hall, and a new multi-use games area, all of which will greatly enhance both learning and extracurricular opportunities for pupils and staff.

Even with St. Aidan's undergoing significant transformation, its proud legacy will continue with features such as the memorial wall and hall of fame images being carefully protected and thoughtfully preserved, before moving into new surroundings. This will ensure the school's unique history and cherished memories remain for future generations.

The teachers at St. Aidan's agree that the new school building will have great impact on both teaching and learning. They believe the upgraded and modern classrooms will allow teachers to adapt spaces for group discussion and independent study, and that the improved building will create an atmosphere of community cohesion.

Pupils Gabriel and Jay, Year 10, are "excited for the new building" as they believe it will be a "good improvement for the community" and the new facilities will create more space as it will "improve the narrow corridors". Both pupils and staff admit that they will miss the nostalgia and memories attached to the old school building, but everyone looks forward to building vibrant new memories in the new school.

Josh Chapman, Site Manager, at Bowmer + Kirkland, the main contractors on the project, said: *"Works on site are progressing well. We are currently working externally on installing the modular panels, while the internal elements of the project are starting to take shape. The internal works consist of partitions to form the new classrooms and installing the mechanical and electrical works. It's great to hear how excited the teachers and students are as we work to build their new school. We would like to thank them and the local community for all their continued support throughout the construction process."*

Healthy Plates, brighter futures: Behind the scenes with Chadwick's Kitchen

School meals are an integral part of the school experience, as a Trust we are fortunate to have our own in house catering team, Chadwick's Kitchen.

Two of our sixth form editorial team chatted to Karen Reiling, the Trust Catering Manager about the impact and importance of providing nutritional and healthy meals for all our pupils to positively contribute towards their education.

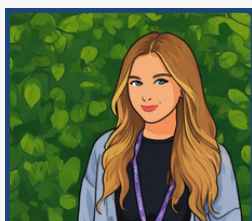
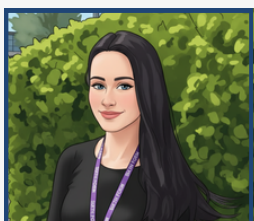
Designing menus for thousands of pupils isn't a quick task. Every dish is carefully planned to meet the School Food Standards, the government's benchmark for healthy eating in education. These standards help ensure that what we serve supports pupils' learning, energy levels, and long-term wellbeing. Current requirements include:

- A daily serving of vegetables or salad
- Fruit-based desserts (at least 50% fruit) twice a week
- No more than two deep-fried, batter-coated, or breadcrumb-coated items per week
- No more than two pastry-based dishes per week
- Protein-rich meals - meat, poultry, or dairy-free alternatives - on at least three days

Alongside this, teams create bespoke menus for pupils with medical diets and continually review ingredients and recipes. In line with the latest health guidance, they are also working to further reduce ultra-processed foods across our menus. They offer a vegetarian option every day and ensure the absence of meat on Fridays to uphold our Catholic traditions.

Sustainable and environmentally friendly practices have become a greater focus, for example, food miles are measured for primary school menus and suppliers are encouraged to reduce packaging and take waste back with them to repurpose or dispose. Sustainability has become a primary focus of catering decisions to maintain environmentally friendly practices and healthy diets.

Thanks to this ongoing effort, our pupils enjoy meals that are not only tasty but genuinely nourishing, which consider sustainability and help them thrive throughout the school day.

Moonshot Scholars: A new partnership expanding opportunities for pupils

In the last issue we shared that our Trust is working in partnership with HMC (Headteacher's Conference) and E-ACT Multi-Academy Trust, on a bold, sector-wide initiative to improve the life chances of every child in the UK and help 100% of Children to Thrive.

As part of this project we will be collaborating with Royal Grammar School (RGS) to launch Moonshot Scholars, a two-year post-16 development programme designed to support high-potential pupils into competitive universities and careers.

Starting with a pilot in 2026, pupils will be selected at the end of Year 11 and offered a personalised pathway that builds aspiration, academic strength, and real-world experience. Thirty students from six partner schools, including RGS, will form the first cohort.



From September 2026, participants will receive:

- One-to-one mentoring
- A personalised Pathway Plan
- Visits to selective universities
- Employer engagement and high-quality work experience
- Preparation for competitive admissions, including Oxbridge and Medicine

Selecting students before Year 12 ensures they benefit from a full two years of targeted support. Alongside the Scholars pilot, Moonshot Explore, will offer all sixth form students access to employer encounters, university insight sessions, skills workshops, and aspiration-building events delivered with RGS and regional partners. This ensures every learner has opportunities to broaden their horizons and build confidence.

RGS brings valuable expertise in high-tariff university progression and will support mentoring, enrichment planning, and cross-sector collaboration. This partnership represents a significant investment in widening access and raising outcomes across our Trust.

Fran Craik, one of the Trust's Chief Standards Officers, said, *"Moonshot is about giving talented young people time, support, and belief. By starting early and partnering with a school of RGS's calibre, we are raising aspiration and ensuring pupils from all backgrounds can reach the highest levels of academic and professional success."*

Recruitment for the first cohort will take place in Spring/Summer 2026 through a competitive application and interview process in all our Trust secondary schools. For more information contact enquiries@bccet.org.uk

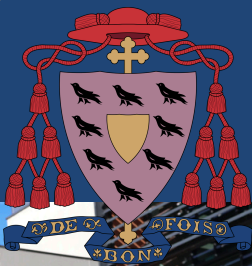
