An excellent opportunity has arisen to join a very successful and forward thinking English Department within a high performing school. GCSE results in 2019 were amongst the highest in the city with 89% of the cohort achieving a 4+ in GCSE English Language with a progress measure of 0.77. Results for GCSE Literature were also impressive with 94% achieving 4+ and a progress measure of 1.00. At Key Stage 5 78% of students in 2019 achieved a grade C and above with a 100% pass rate.

Applicants will have had some experience of teaching across the ability range at KS3 and KS4 and must be passionate, well organised, and hardworking, with high expectations of students and colleagues. Successful candidates will be given the opportunity to develop teaching resources and other assessment materials. An ability to teach A level is desirable but not essential. The post is suitable for an NQT or someone with a little more experience.

We provide a first class INSET programme at Bishop Challoner, which supports the professional development of teachers at all stages in their careers.

Bishop Challoner is a very successful, heavily over-subscribed mixed 11-19 Catholic comprehensive school in the South of Birmingham. We were designated one of the first 100 Teaching Schools in the country and we are also a lead school for the Central Maths Hub, the Central Midland Science Learning Partnership, the Schools Sports Partnership and most recently, the Central Computing Hub. Having had the chance to read our recruitment pack and find out a little bit more about our school and our department, I very much look forward to receiving your application.

Staffing

The English Department is made up of a strong team of 12 specialist teachers. It is a very friendly and extremely supportive group of colleagues. The department has 8 well-resourced teaching rooms.

Results

Our results have been consistently high year on year and in August 2019 our students achieved:

- 88% at grade 4 and above English Language
- 94% at grade 4 and above English Literature
- At A Level 100% at grades A*-E

Our Curriculum

At the core of our ethos in the English Department is the drive to inspire, motivate and support students in their learning throughout the school but also to inspire an appreciation of the power of Literature and to encourage a love of reading. We believe that through an engaging curriculum we can encourage pupils to reflect on the world in a meaningful and critical way and increase their cultural capital through their exploration of Literature and non-fiction texts.

Throughout the major curriculum reforms of GCSE's and A-levels, this philosophy has been central to our ethos. Despite our successes, the Department is always reflecting on practice and looking at opportunities to improve the experience of English for our students.

Through this philosophy, we will aim to:

- Ensure that teaching and learning in English lessons is of a high quality, meets the needs of our students and is in accordance with the National Curriculum.
- Provide high challenge and expectations for all abilities and allow students opportunities to celebrate their success and recognise individual achievement.
- Instil a life-long love of reading and develop resilience when faced with challenging texts.
- Give students the opportunity to experience the theatre.
- Develop and refine our students' use of language, promoting vocabulary acquisition.
- Develop our students' knowledge, experience and accuracy of spoken and written forms of English language.

- Ensure that English provides students with opportunities for personal growth, developing moral and social awareness.
- Function as a team in developing and sharing common approaches to the teaching of English, working in collaboration with other schools.
- Contribute fully to the life and work of the School.
- Enhance students' creativity and enjoyment in writing in a range of forms.
- Provide regular enrichment activities through the Arts Project, Poetry competitions, Debating, Writing and Book Clubs.
- Utilise the latest pedagogical research, in order to inform teaching strategies and lesson design.

At Key Stage 3 we offer a rich and varied curriculum. Students will engage with a range of classic and modern texts, covering all genres. In Y7, students will study *A Christmas Carol* and *Animal Farm* as well as exploring a variety of non-fiction texts and poetry. Writing challenges and Reading lessons happen every fortnight promoting literacy but also encouraging creativity.

At Key Stage 4 we follow the AQA Specification. Students will study *Romeo and Juliet, Frankenstein, An Inspector Calls* and Power and Conflict Poetry as part of GCSE English Literature.

At Key Stage 5 we follow the Edexcel Specification. Students will study *Othello* and *A Streetcar Named Desire.* They will also study Gothic horror, focusing on *Dracula* and *The Little Stranger*. In terms of poetry, they will study a range of post 2000 poems, develop unseen poetry analysis and study the poetry of Christina Rossetti.

Providing students with a range of extra-curricular activities is at the core of our ethos in the English Department. Everyone in the Department should aim to provide at least one enriching activity throughout the year.
