- **4. Stay connected to friends and family** We deal better with stress when we work together. Modern tech lets us stay connected remotely with our friends and loved ones.

KEBLE COLLEGE ACCESS AND OUTREACH PROGRAM

In this programme, Year 12 students are encouraged to investigate, play with, and critically respond to questions tackling race and class. 




Pathways to Law

SIR DOUG ELLIS PATHWAY TO HEALTHCARE PROGRAMME AT ASTON UNIVERSITY

Applications for the next cohort on the Sir Doug Ellis Pathway to Healthcare Programme are now open and will be live until Friday 2nd October 2020. As part of Aston Medical School's commitment to continual improvement, this year applications will be completed via an online form.

Who is the pathway for?

Places on the Pathway to Healthcare Programme are open to students entering Year 12 in September 2020 at a non-selective school/college in the Birmingham, Solihull or the Black Country region. Students must have a genuine interest in pursuing a career within Medicine or healthcare. Over the 18 month programme, which students complete alongside studying for their A-Levels, successful applicants will be given the opportunity to take part in various enrichment activities. This includes healthcare subject taster days, A-Level Revision boot camps, academic tutoring and specialist university application and interview preparation workshops.

What are the requirements?

Places on the programme are offered on a competitive basis. Students who apply should fulfil the key eligibility criteria listed on the Aston University website <u>here</u>.
