

Apprenticeships



What is an apprenticeship?

- Combine practical training in a job with periods of study
- Earn a wage from day one
- Get valuable work experience
- Work towards a nationally recognised qualification, and sometimes industry qualifications too
- Apprenticeships are available in most industries, including STEM and Law!



Apprenticeship levels

- **Traineeship:** Level 1 or Level 2 (equivalent to GCSEs or below)
- Intermediate: Level 2 (equivalent to 5 GCSEs)
- Advanced: Level 3 (equivalent to 2 A-levels)
- Higher: Level 4 and above (equivalent to Foundation degree and higher)
- Degree apprenticeship: Level 6 or Level 7 (equivalent to Bachelor's or master's degree
- School Leaver Programme: Some employers run their own bespoke training programmes. A-level students can work towards a degree and/or professional qualification

When is the deadline for applications?

Will this apprenticeship lead to a job? Either with this employer, or within this industry?




- Covid-19 has increased already fierce competition as fewer companies are recruiting
- Think about how you will stand out to an employer
 - Relevant (virtual) work experience
 - Online courses (MOOCs)
- It is not an easy option!
 - You will need to make MANY applications
 - There **may** be a number of stages of the recruitment process (especially the larger companies!) online assessment, group activity, interview etc.
- You will need a tailored CV for the type of apprenticeship you're applying for
