November is the month of remembrance and thanks giving. We pray for those who have gone before us. We light candles in the memory of our loved ones and recall the joy of stories once told. We follow in their footsteps reliving their legacy by doing well to others.

Patrick Colm Smyth, known to all of us in the Bishop Challoner Community as 'Col'! A true Irish gentleman who would stop and talk to friend and stranger, treating everyone as equal and would go out of his way for those in greater need. His infectious personality would lift the mood of any on the darkest day. A hardworking man, strong religious faith and in touch with reality. Col loved Christmas. He loved the joy it brought to his family and to his grandchildren. Each year he took great pride in presenting his amazing crib that he displayed at home in his kitchen. Each year he would never forget the many

children worldwide that desperately wanted to be loved on Christmas day. Col's commitment to the Samaritan's Purse Shoe Box appeal was stunning.



The project delivers not only the joy of what, for many kids, is their first gift ever, but also gives them a tangible expression of God's love. Each year he would personally collect 40-50 shoe boxes to donate to the charity and would encourage and inspire so many others to do the same. His legacy, and our memory of a dear friend, lives on through our Colm Smyth Shoe Box charity appeal. An amazing effort by all our students, families and staff over the past weeks has ensured that there will be smiles on over 440 children on Christmas day when they open

their gift. An incredible return when you take current challenges into account. We thank you for your support with this initiative.

This is the sixth year of commemoration of Armistice Day by the Art Department. New additions this year include two large scale poppies which feature the poem 'Perhaps' by Vera Brittain. Eight local women, some of whom are related to members of the Challoner community and who all made a personal contribtuion to the Second World War effort are also remembered through displaying their portraits and stories. Allergy Management

Bishop Challoner Catholic College aims to minimise the risk to pupils and staff with allergies, including those who are allergic to nuts.

It is vital that staff and parents/carers and pupils adhere to the Allergy Management policy, as we have both pupils and staff in school who suffer from allergies, including nut allergies.

Persons with allergies, including a nut allergy can suffer life-threatening consequences if they come into contact with allergens, including nuts, either through ingestion or through touch.

Parents/carers, pupils and staff must not bring or send, any food into school either for packed lunches or for snacks/treats with nuts in.

For example, the following items should not be brought into school:

Packs of nuts
Peanut butter sandwiches
Fruit and cereal bars that contain nuts
Chocolate bars or sweets that contain nuts
Cakes or biscuits made with nuts
Nutella
Muesli bars

Care should be taken when exchanging gifts, in particular at Easter, Christmas and birthdays.

SPACE

Wash hands - keep washing your hands regularly Cover face wear a face covering in enclosed spaces Make space stay at least 2 metres apart - or 1 metre with a face covering or other precautions

If you have symptoms (high temperature, a new, continuous cough, loss of, or change to your sense of smell or taste) - get a test. Do not leave home for at least 10 days if your test result is positive.

If someone in your house has symptoms, stay at home until they have their test results. If they are positive you must stay at home for 14 days from the first day of symptoms.

DfE guidance for parents/carers

A reminder to make families aware of the government's guidance 'What parents and carers need to know about early years providers, schools and colleges in the autumn term'. This guidance sets out when children and young people may be unable to attend school in line with public health advice to self-isolate because they:
