Teaching School Update

After several months of working remotely, the Teaching School Team is pleased to be back in a 'real' office and able to set up programmes and training courses for this new academic year. We had an especially busy June and July with recruiting new trainee teachers to our PGCE/School Direct Programme, and 70 trainees started on our course just last week! Working with our Primary and Secondary partner schools has meant that we have secured host schools for all our trainees. We are excited to not only continue working with the University of Warwick and Newman University, but also this year with Birmingham City University.

Recruitment will open in early October for trainees looking to start in September 2021, so we look forward the process starting all over again!
