

### **Careers News**

I'm Miss Darby, the Careers Leader at Bishop Challoner Catholic College. At the end of Year 9 students will be making some decisions about their future studies. Which subjects are right for them and where they lead them to is up to the student! The more your son/daughter can research careers this year, the easier it will be to decide.

To help Year 9, they will have access to Unifrog, which we will be launching after Christmas. Unifrog is an online tool which will tell you what careers would be a good match for your personality and your interests. It also has a Careers library built into it which will give your child loads of brilliant information about all sorts of careers. The Subjects library can give ideas about what careers they could do, if they like a specific subject at school. So no matter what stage they are at with their careers research, Unifrog will be able to help!

As well as using Unifrog during form time after Christmas, Year 9 will also receive a number of assemblies which will explain what specific subjects are like in Years 10 and 11.

#### **Black History Month**

October is national Black History Month. The aim of this month is to raise awareness and celebrate black history. To begin the month, all year groups have had an informative form time sessions about black history in the UK. The form session included information about how our diverse country came to be and how black history dates back over 2000 years in the UK. Famous and influential black figures both modern and historical, from the UK, were also shared. These role models demonstrate exceptional skill, resilience or influence and through those examples, we challenge all students to believe they can do anything they put their mind to.



#### **Class Charts**

Class Charts, a system introduced during lockdown, is a phenomenal resource for parents/carers to see and view how their child is performing in school. It illustrates their behaviours and positive logs as well as homework set, due dates and whether it was completed. Indeed, if homework is completed via class-charts, the feedback is also available to see here. I would encourage you to use this system. #### Timings of the day

The timings of the day have altered for Year 9 whereby their lessons start, as you are aware, at 9.00am. Please be aware that this is the start of lesson and therefore it is important that students are prompt.

#### Schoolcomms

As you are aware we operate a cashless catering system and Schoolcomms is the only system to make payments for your child's school dinners and school trips. There is only one money loading machine in operation in the school so it is imperative that Schoolcomms is used. For further information please visit our website <u>www.bishopchalloner.org.uk</u>

#### **Uniform and Appearance**

Students are required to wear the standard uniform of blazer, tie, white/blue shirt with black straight leg school trousers (not skinny or boot cut) or girls can wear a knee length black school skirt. Girls are also reminded that if they choose to wear a skirt, then they should wear plain, black, opaque tights. Students are reminded that black leather school shoes should be worn and that trainers/trainer style shoes and boots are forbidden.

Please note that school shoes must be kept completely black. There are a number of styles, particularly for girls, currently in fashion with wood style soles. These are not suitable for school. School shoes should also be leather and not patent.

In order to complement the smart school uniform we insist that students' hair is smart in appearance and that students do not have shaved/razored hair styles or lines/patterns shaved into the hair. Extreme changes of hair colour are also not permitted. The final decision as to whether a particular haircut/style is appropriate is at the discretion of senior staff.

Make up, nail varnish and jewellery are not permitted with the exception of one pair of stud earrings which may be worn by girls.

## **Mobile Phones**

With most students in school now owning mobile phones for use to and from school, it is important that they are also not a distraction to study. Students found with mobile phones during lessons and around the school will have them confiscated and they will be returned at the discretion of senior staff/Heads of Year. In more persistent cases, phones may only be returned to parents/carers.

I know that you will, as always, support us in maintaining the smart appearance of your children and high standards of discipline, so that our focus in school can be on educational achievement.

# Attendance and Punctuality

Considering the situation we find ourselves in the attendance of Year 9 this half term is very pleasing. We hope that this will continue for the remainder of the academic year. We will continue to strive to meet our attendance target of 97%.

If your child is absent from school, a notification phone call needs to be made to the school on the first day of the absence and every further day that they are absent too. Upon return to school, a written note needs to be handed in to their form tutor, stating the reason for absence. Please encourage your child to be at school by 8.30am to instil the important life skill of good punctuality.

## **Absence Reporting and Covid-19**

If your son/daughter is required to self-isolate in line with government guidance work will only be made available via Class Charts when the school is informed. Please keep school informed of any progress regarding testing. **If your son/daughter's is confirmed positive please inform the school immediately**.

## **Bike Safety**

It is good to see a higher proportion of students cycling to school, we will be providing additional bike parking racks in the near future. It is essential that your son/daughter rides responsibly and they MUST wear a helmet. Should we have any concerns re your son/daughters road safety we will be in touch.
