The Gospel Reading Today:


Matthew 5:38-42

Offer the wicked man no resistance

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You have learnt how it was said: Eye for eye and tooth for tooth. But I say this to you: offer the wicked man no resistance. On the contrary, if anyone hits you on the right cheek, offer him the other as well; if a man takes you to law and would have your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him. Give to anyone who asks, and if anyone wants to borrow, do not turn away.'

Reflection:

The Lord is calling us to be the best versions of ourselves. To get rid of the cause of our sin to make us closer to Him. He wants the best for us and we are called to be disciples of all nations. This means showing God's love and values to all. To show his work to all we encounter. We must also live out the ten commandments whilst we do this and try and be the most virtuous person
