The Gospel Reading Today:

I am the living bread which has come down from heaven

Jesus said to the crowd:

'No one can come to me
unless he is drawn by the Father who sent me,
and I will raise him up at the last day.
It is written in the prophets:
They will all be taught by God,
and to hear the teaching of the Father,
and learn from it,
is to come to me.
Not that anybody has seen the Father,
except the one who comes from God:

he has seen the Father.

I tell you most solemnly,

everybody who believes has eternal life.

'I am the bread of life.

Your fathers ate the manna in the desert

and they are dead;

but this is the bread that comes down from heaven,

so that a man may eat it and not die.

I am the living bread which has come down from heaven.

Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever;

and the bread that I shall give is my flesh,

for the life of the world.'

Reflection:

'I will raise that person on the last day.' Faith is what makes my life last for ever, it brings fullness to my life. I thank Jesus for offering himself for me and for calling me to believe in him. I stand in awe at how important I am to God: the Father draws me to Jesus, who will raise me up on the last day.

Prayer

We watch Jesus gradually inviting his hearers to understand what he means by saying that he is the bread of life. First, he opens them up to awareness of their need. Then he offers himself. Am I self-sufficient or do I know my need? Lord I pray to know your need in our life and desire for Your work and presence in my life.
