# Message from Mr Hetherton, Senior Vice Principal

## Friday 11th March 2022

Last week marked the beginning of the meteorological season of spring – a time of new beginnings, longer days, rejuvenation, and an enthusiasm for what comes next. Last week also marked the beginning of the season of Lent - a period of great significance for Christians throughout the world and a time that provides us all with opportunities for reflection, prayer, and renewal. In observing the 40 days of Lent, Christians attempt to replicate Christ's sacrifice and withdrawal into the desert for 40 days and his ultimate sacrifice for us all on the Cross.

But sacrifice is relative – how does any Lenten sacrifice that we might undertake compare to Christ's sacrifice or to the sacrifices currently being made by the people of Ukraine? Nonetheless, the opportunity to reflect during Lent offers us a chance to consider how we can serve others and how we can offer some support and solidarity to people in real need.

The tragic events that are unfolding in Ukraine is a humanitarian disaster of significant proportions and can overwhelm us

whenever we pause to think about what is happening. The outstanding work of the Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC) in providing




shelter, food and water for the millions of displaced Ukrainians is a wonderful example of how we can all offer some support and solidarity to people in real need.

Examples of support include:

- £30 can provide essential hygiene supplies for 3 Ukrainians for a month
- £50 can provide blankets for 4 Ukrainian families
- The government will match pound-for-pound up to £20 million donated by the public to this appeal. An opportunity to provide up to £40 million of support!

A non-fungible token, or NFT, is a unique digital record of a particular file – such as an image, audio track or video (non-fungible meaning it can't be replaced by an identical item). NFTs let digital content producers like artists and designers control how their work is distributed and monetised. The offline equivalent would be owning a limited-edition art print, signed by the artist, with a certificate of authentication. The value of NFTs is incredibly volatile, unregulated and very much based on hype, publicity and marketing. These digital assets – typically collectibles, avatars for social media profiles or character add-ons for online games – are traded in specialised marketplaces using cryptocurrency.


