Teaching School Update

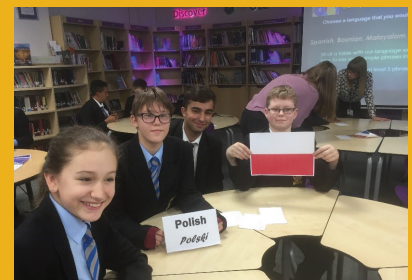

UCAS news

Our early applicants (those who are applying for Medicine/Dentistry or Oxbridge colleges) have either sent off their applications, or are about to do so, ahead of the 15th October deadline. Students are starting to get offers, which is very exciting.

Predicted Grades for UCAS

These are decided by an experienced team of Sixth Form staff, in discussion with the students, with a view to supporting aspirations and ensuring that realistic choices are met. A variety of information is considered when arriving at the appropriate predicted grades including Year 12 Mock results, the end of year report and, just as importantly, current attitude and commitment to study.

The Jericho Foundation

On Monday 7th October the Sixth Form had an assembly delivered by the Jericho Foundation. This is a local charity which works to support those marginalised in society by providing work opportunities through social enterprise. Amongst those supported are those leaving prison, at risk of homelessness and survivors of modern day slavery. It was particularly interesting, and saddening, to be reminded that slavery is by no means a thing of the past. Several students have already expressed an interest in doing some fund and awareness raising for this very worthwhile local cause.

Realising Opportunities Programme

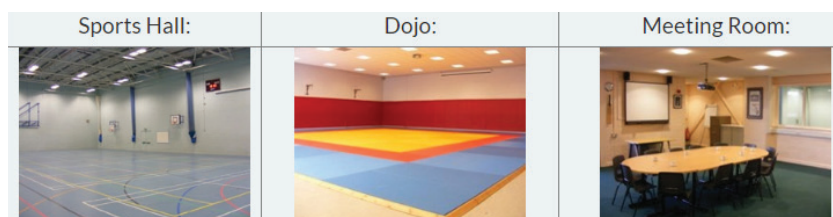
