OFSTED

As parents and carers will know, Bishop Challoner Catholic College had its OFSTED inspection last week under the revised framework for the inspection of schools. CELEBRATING THE FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY

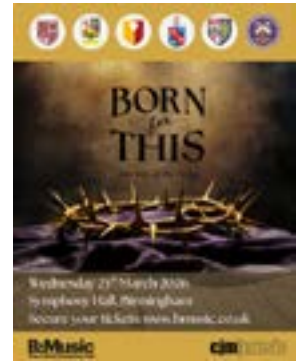


BORN FOR THIS - A MOVING PRODUCTION

Each final piece reflected the individuality of the student behind it, demonstrating not only technical skill but also confidence, creativity, and personal expression, we were very proud of the commitment, maturity, perseverance and creativity they showed throughout the process.

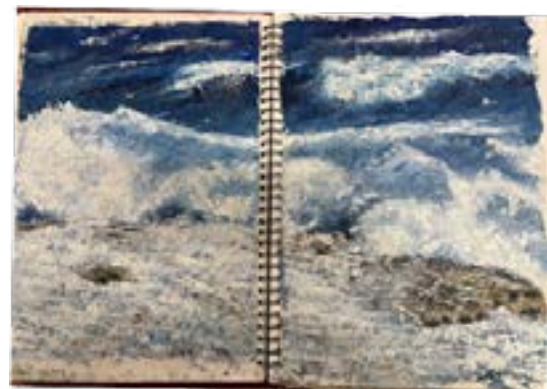
Year 13 students are reaching the final stages of their Personal Investigation projects, a journey that has seen each student select a theme or issue that truly matters to them. Over time, they have explored these ideas in depth, developing thoughtful and personal creative responses through sustained research, experimentation, and reflection.

YEAR 9 JEWELLERY WORKSHOP

Seventeen Year 9 students have recently taken part in a jewellery workshop in partnership with the School of Jewellery, giving them a unique opportunity to explore design through a powerful and socially relevant theme. During the workshop, students were introduced to a striking collection of jewelry responding to the issue of knife crime, prompting thoughtful discussion and reflection.

Using this as inspiration, students selected issues that were important and meaningful to them personally. With guidance from expert tutors, they were introduced to the design process and practical techniques needed to begin creating their own pendant designs. The session encouraged students to think creatively, communicate ideas, and respond to challenging themes through visual outcomes.

The students are due to visit the School of Jewellery next week, where they will refine and complete their designs. Both the master tutors and visiting jewellery students commented on how engaged, focused, and creative our students were throughout the workshop.



SILVERSTONE MUSEUM

Year 10 Explore the World of Motorsport at Silverstone Museum
On Tuesday 13th January, fifty Year 10 pupils from Bishop Challoner Catholic College enjoyed an exciting and educational day at the Silverstone Museum. The trip offered pupils a unique opportunity to discover the science, history and technology behind Formula 1 racing.

The day began with a hands on workshop where pupils explored the specialist materials used in Formula 1—from the carbon fibre in the cars to the protective suits and gloves worn by drivers. They learned how each material is carefully selected for its strength, flexibility, heat resistance or safety, and why these properties are essential in high speed motorsport.

A guided tour of the museum followed, giving pupils the chance to step back in time and discover Silverstone's pivotal role in the history and evolution of Formula 1. From early racing machines to modern engineering breakthroughs, students were able to see how racing technology has rapidly developed over the decades.

In the afternoon, pupils put their skills to the test in the race simulators, competing to set the fastest valid lap around the iconic Silverstone track. They also had time to explore the exhibitions further, and finally got to experience The Ultimate Lap, a thrilling 4D cinema journey through a high speed circuit.

The visit was both educational and exhilarating, giving students an unforgettable insight into the world of motorsport engineering, history and innovation.

LAMMA LADIES JAUNT TO THE NEC

Bishop Challoner Catholic College was thrilled to be one of just a handful of local schools awarded a £500 grant from the NFU (National Farmers Union) to take 14 Year 9 BAME girls on an exciting trip to the LAMMA Show at the NEC on Thursday 15th January 2026. LAMMA is the UK's biggest and boldest agricultural machinery, equipment and technology show, attracting over 40,000 visitors every year — and our students got to be right in the middle of it all!



From high-tech farming machinery to the latest innovations shaping the future of agriculture, the girls explored it all. The NFU organised a fantastic day packed with hands-on activities, including scavenger hunts around the exhibition and building electrical circuits to measure potential difference. Friendly NFU volunteers guided the girls around the show, answered questions and helped them complete their challenges along the way.

The trip also opened eyes to the huge range of careers available in agriculture. Our Challoner students confidently chatted with exhibitors, asking thoughtful questions about career pathways, new technologies and the skills needed to succeed in the industry. The day ended on a high note with swag bags in hand and plenty of smiles after a memorable visit to the NEC. Huge thanks go Mrs Coley and Mrs Newton for taking the girls on such a brilliant day out!



ASSEMBLIES

It has been an incredibly busy and productive start to 2026 across our assemblies and form time programme.

We welcomed pupils back to school with a re-set assembly, offering a valuable opportunity for reflection on the history of New Year celebrations, dating back to Julius Caesar and the creation of the 365¼-day year. Pupils explored traditions that symbolically close the door on the past and open the door to new beginnings, while also being encouraged to set realistic and achievable targets for 2026. This message was closely linked to health and wellbeing and rooted in Christian values, reflecting on St Paul's words: "If anyone is in Christ, they are a new creation." This reminder reinforced the belief that, with God, new beginnings are always possible, regardless of what the previous year may have held.

Throughout the week, pupils in Key Stage 3 have focused on the importance of readiness for learning, particularly through effective use of lesson materials on Microsoft Teams. This theme of preparation continued into Key Stage 4, where pupils revisited the BC Basics using the analogy of being ready to take part in a race. Drawing on the New Testament metaphor of an athletic race for a life well lived, pupils reflected on the words from the Book of Hebrews: "Let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us."

+ FIRST AID INFORMATION AND PROCEDURES

Medication; All medication should be handed into first aid and not carried by the students. Exception EpiPen, Asthma inhalers and insulin as well as Tranexamic acid in special circumstances.

Please make sure we have the correct medical information and emergency contact details. If you have changed your phone number or there is any change in medical conditions or concerns, please contact first aid using the enquiries email or the main school phone number.

Please send children into school with a water bottle which they can re-fill at our water stations provided. Alternatively, they can purchase a drink from the school canteen.

Students with Asthma must carry their own personal inhalers with them. This includes offsite activities and school trips to ensure they can participate safely.

Parents/Carers of students with a known allergy must provide school first aid with antihistamine; this also applies to those with anaphylaxis in addition to their EpiPen.

We do not provide liquid paracetamol such as Calpol. If your child cannot take tablets and you would prefer them to have liquid Calpol, please send this in to the school first aider with your child's name on it. This will be kept safe in first aid for your child only.

FORM RESOURCES

During form time over the past fortnight, pupils have explored the Feast of the Epiphany and how it is celebrated across the world, from festivals and street processions to the sharing of gifts and participation in religious services. Pupils learned that the Wise Men were not kings, were not Jewish, and were not powerful rulers, but came from different countries and cultures. This understanding highlighted why Epiphany is celebrated globally and how it reminds us of the universal search for truth. Pupils particularly enjoyed creating their own quizzes and reflecting on how Epiphany calls us to:

- Welcome others
- Respect differences
- Be curious, kind, and open-hearted

This week's focus has been on wellbeing, with a key message of bringing happiness and joy to January. Pupils discussed how experiencing a wide range of emotions is completely normal and explored ways to develop resilience. These discussions were supported by practical strategies for managing mental health, culminating in pupils creating their own personalised 'toolkits' for wellbeing.

FIRST AID AND MOBILE PHONES

Students should not be contacting parents/carers when they feel unwell and requesting to be collected from school. If a student is unwell, they **MUST** go to the First Aider who will deal with them. If a student is not well enough to stay in school, the First Aider will contact parents/carers to arrange collection.

Students who contact their parents/carer directly and do not follow the procedures in place will be sanctioned, this may result in their mobile phone having to be handed in to the student services office each day. The use of anyone else's mobile phone risks that person being sanctioned also.

Please do not arrive at school to collect your child unless school have contacted you to do so. We do not have school staff readily available to collect children. Thank you for your support and co-operation.

UNIFORM STANDARDS

Students are required to wear the standard uniform of blazer, tie, white/blue shirt with black straight leg school trousers (not skinny or boot cut) or girls can wear a knee length black pleated school skirt. Girls are also reminded that if they choose to wear a skirt, then they should wear plain, black, opaque tights. Students are reminded that black leather school shoes should be worn and that trainers/trainer style shoes are forbidden.

Please note that school shoes must be kept completely black and boots of any kind are not allowed.

Our uniform requirements are complemented by a smart appearance and as such, hair styles that should not have a distinct contrast in length. Hair that is dyed must be of a natural hair colour and may not contain more than one colour. To avoid a health and safety risk, long hair must not impede vision or cover the face, except for a fringe which must not cover the eyes. Long hair must be tied up for practical lessons. Religious head coverings must be black and securely tied for practical lessons. Hair bands or accessories must be for functional use to secure the hair. Where hairbands are worn they must be black. Headwear that has religious or cultural purpose should be black. The final decision as to whether a particular haircut/style is appropriate is at the discretion of senior staff.

Make up, nail varnish and jewellery are not permitted, with the exception of one pair of plain stud gold or silver earrings which may be worn.

Students found to be wearing an inappropriate item of uniform may be asked to change this or, in some cases, parents/carers will be contacted and requested to bring replacement uniform to school.

We appreciate your support in ensuring that standards of uniform and appearance are maintained.



REPORTING AN ABSENCE

All students are required to attend school/college on time every day. If for any reason your child is unable to attend, please ensure that the school attendance policy is followed, and their absence is reported before the START of the school day (8.40am) and on each day of absence.
