Message from Mrs Baptiste, Assistant Principal

As we reflect on the acts of Remembrance through BC Arts Hub's 'Service of Remembrance' and Remembrance Sunday masses and events, we honour the memory of the fallen and pledge to care for the living.

'A Service of Remembrance'

Last year, Bishop Challoner Arts Hub created a celebratory Arts event that explored, celebrated and commemorated memory in all its forms - a journey of what it means to remember, told through a promenade theatre-style trail. This year, to commemorate Remembrance, the vision was to create a more intimate experience for our community in the form of a 'Service of Remembrance'. This involved collaborating with St Dunstan's Church along with the many departments and students at Bishop Challoner, to ensure the vision was realised successfully. This year's theme reflected on the value of 'service', remembering all those who have served and sacrificed, with soldiers, sailors, airmen and women represented, together with members of the emergency services and civilians, ensuring that no-one is forgotten. The event also included a special tribute to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, who was the Royal British Legion's Patron for 70 years.

The 'Service of Remembrance' led the community on an intimate journey of discovery through art, music, dramatic and spoken word performances. The service began with an opening prayer by Father Phillip, followed by reflective songs performed by vocal ensembles, including KS3 and KS4 students, a dramatic performance about the Falklands War monologue, poetry performed by Year 10 students and a live rendition of The Last Post and the National Anthem, on trombone, performed by Year 12 musician, Sophie F.

The service was powerful, emotional, respectful and extremely poignant. Our Year 12, young poet, AJ F complemented the service with a series of spoken word performances. This was an exciting opportunity to experience a future BC poetry star! It was lovely to bring the evening to a close by stepping back in time, enjoying tea and wartime cake, kindly baked by BC staff, whilst listening to renowned wartime songs, such as Dame Vera Lynn's The White Cliffs of Dover, We'll Meet Again, and A Nightingale Sang in Berkeley Square, performed by Ilana M-S, Erin H-L and Robyn O'D.



Year 7 and 8 boys competed in the School Games Indoor Athletics event which was held at Billesley Tennis Centre. The team from year 7 showed great character and determination, and just missed out on first place, finishing second to Wheelers Lane. After winning last year, the year 8 team were defending their title, and started confidently



by winning their first race. The boys put in some great performances in both their track and field events. A thrilling finish ended with beating Camp Hill Boys School to first place by a single point. The Year 8 win puts them through to the Birmingham finals, where they will compete for the regional title at the University of Birmingham.

Football

The Year 7 boys football team have an upcoming fixture against Cardinal Newman in the second round of the West Midlands Cup. If the boys win, they progress into the third round against very testing opposition.

Netball

Year 7 netball team drew their first match of the season which is a sublime result for the girls and is their first positive result, It is amazing to see the progression the girls have made over the last few weeks and we cant wait to see what they achieve throughout the season.

Uniform Standards

Students are required to wear the standard uniform of blazer, tie, white/blue shirt with black straight leg school trousers (not skinny or boot cut) or girls can wear a knee length black school skirt (not lycra or stretchy). Girls are also reminded that if they choose to wear a skirt, then they should wear plain, black, opaque tights. Students are reminded that black leather school shoes should be worn and that trainers/trainer style shoes are forbidden.

Please note that school shoes must be kept completely black and boots of any kind are not allowed.

In order to complement the smart school uniform we insist that students' hair is smart in appearance and that students do not have shaved/razored hair styles or lines/patterns shaved into the hair. Extreme changes of hair colour are also not permitted. The final decision as to whether a particular haircut/style is appropriate is at the discretion of senior staff.

Make up, nail varnish and jewellery are not permitted with the exception of one pair of plain stud earrings which may be worn.

Please note that lycra or stretchy skirts are not allowed to be worn. Students found to be wearing an inappropriate item of uniform may be asked to change this or in some cases parents/carers will be contacted and requested to bring replacement uniform to school.


