Crypto Currency became headline news during 2020 and 2021 as Bitcoin rose to a record high valuation. Alongside Bitcoin, many other 'coins' saw a sharp increase in value, that is until, the crash towards the end of 2021; Bitcoin lost nearly 30% in value from its peak. Many people wrongly interpret crypto currency as a quick money spinner with



little to no risk, this is not true. Like any financial market, there are winners and losers with many people having lost savings, pension funds, and other substantial investments during the crash.

Due to the digital nature of the currencies, it is very easy to trade in large monetary amounts from a smart device. We encourage parents and carers to discuss crypto currency with their children, in particular the notation that financial and stock markets come with considerable risk. A risk compounded when individuals are entering a complicated field, they know very little about.

Uniform Standards

Students are required to wear the standard uniform of blazer, tie, white/blue shirt with black straight leg school trousers (not skinny or boot cut) or girls can wear a knee length black school skirt (not lycra or stretchy). Girls are also reminded that if they choose to wear a skirt, then they should wear plain, black, opaque tights. Students are reminded that black leather school shoes should be worn and that trainers/trainer style shoes are forbidden.

Please note that school shoes must be kept completely black and boots of any kind are not allowed.

In order to complement the smart school uniform we insist that students' hair is smart in appearance and that students do not have shaved/razored hair styles or lines/ patterns shaved into the hair. Extreme changes of hair colour are also not permitted. The final decision as to whether a particular haircut/style is appropriate is at the discretion of senior staff. **Braids are allowed.**
