

Challenges Abroad Peru Trip

On Friday 13th June 2025 a group of Sixth Form students made the 27 hours journey to Peru. Here is an update of their experience so far:

"Students have now really got into the swing of delivering lessons to the students and the feedback from the school is that they are the most creative and highest quality lessons they have seen at such an early stage into the workshops. The Peruvian students at the school we work at mostly come from very challenging parts of the valley where many do not have access to basic amenities. Having our students there means students develop their conversational English skills which can really help them in the future secure jobs in the tourist industry in particular in other parts of the country. Student absenteeism is extremely high in this part of Peru but students like coming to school when they have volunteers in from Challenges abroad and our students have done a brilliant job so far. The last volunteers in this school were 3 months ago to this particular isolated school, so the students were delighted to welcome Bishop Challoner students to their school. Our students have also been painting a mural and updating some of the school facilities in between delivering their lessons. Yesterday we went on a hike and enjoyed some of the amazing views of the valley."













Assembly and Form Resource Focus

Our assembly programme continues to inspire our students and raise awareness of the world around them, whilst our Faithful Virtues remain at the core of everything we deliver. Last week, ahead of County Lines Awareness Week on June 23rd, students were made aware of what 'County Lines' actually means and what they need to be aware of in terms of their own personal safety. This is part of our preventative curriculum and promotes the Faithful Virtues of being Learned and Understanding. This week, across the school, we have celebrated Refugee Week. As a School of Sanctuary, this was also our theme for assembly and students were able to explore some facts about refugees and asylum seekers rooted in Matthew's Gospel 'I was a stranger and you welcomed me'.

The Form Resource programme continues to explore cultural and personal development themes, weekly. My Money Week led to some great afternoon sessions where students were able to understand what budgeting is and start to plan how some-one might budget and save from their salary. Lots of maths took place across the school as students started to grasp some of the financial challenges that the future may hold; with tips for financial well-being and security! With warmer temperatures, it was only too apt that this week we have looked at Water Safety with a focus on staying away from canals and rivers to cool off during these warmer days. Students were able to watch some important safety videos and of course, advice was given that swimming should always take place in a supervised pool or allocated area.

Science Club

As we reflect on another enriching term at our school, the Science Club has been a hub of creativity, exploration, and hands-on learning. Our members have embarked on a journey of scientific discovery that has captivated minds and inspired curiosity. Throughout the term, our members have engaged in a variety of exciting activities that have brought science to life in remarkable ways.

Here are some of the standout moments:

Fire Writing: Students delved into the chemistry of combustion as they created mesmerizing patterns with flames, exploring the principles of heat transfer and chemical reactions.

Wind-Up Cars: Engineering came alive as students designed and built their own wind-up cars, applying concepts of mechanical energy, friction, and motion to create vehicles that raced with enthusiasm.

Steady Hand Game: The intricacies of electrical circuits and motor control were mastered as members constructed and fine-tuned their steady hand games, testing their dexterity and patience.

Microscope Adventures: From microscopic organisms to everyday objects magnified, students peered into the unseen world with awe and wonder, discovering the beauty and complexity hidden at the smallest scales.

These activities, among many others, have not only enhanced our understanding of scientific principles but have also fostered teamwork, problem-solving skills, and a passion for inquiry-based learning.

Science Club is eager to continue exploring new frontiers and engaging in projects that challenge and inspire. We encourage all students who are curious about the world around them to join us and embark on this incredible journey of discovery.


Year 7 & 10 Parent Consultation Day

New Bus Route Campaign

A campaign has started for a new bus route to connect Heartlands to the QE via Kings Heath. The route would go something like: Heartlands Hospital - Bordesley Green - Small Heath - Sparkbrook - Sparkhill - Moseley - Kings Heath - Stirchley - Selly Park - Bournbrook - University of Birmingham - Queen Elizabeth Hospital

There are two hospitals, a university, and four large schools along this route, and a bus service here could help cut down on congestion and help traffic to flow more quickly.

734 students at Bishop Challenor are in these postcodes - 304 without an alternative bus route (out of 1233)- that's 60% and 25% of students.

Birmingham City Council offers the following advice:

Water safety in parks

We want all visitors to Birmingham's parks to enjoy their visit. However it is important for your own safety that you should follow these water safety rules:

- never swim or play in lakes, reservoirs, rivers, canals or any other form of open water
- never allow children to play near water without an adult present
- · do not run by the water you may trip and fall in

If you see someone in trouble in the water

- never jump into the water yourself
- keep calm and throw them something that will float, e.g. a lifebuoy if one is available
- phone 999 for help

Summer Uniform

In light of the weather forecast summer uniform can be worn.

Students **DO NOT** have to wear a-Tie Blazer Jumper

Students **MUST** wear-Shirts tucked in Shoes not trainers

If a 2nd layer is worn, this **MUST** be a blazer **NOT** a jumper or other outer wear, any item other than a blazer will be confiscated.

Girls must wear natural or black tights.

Students are reminded that black leather school shoes should be worn and that trainers/trainer style shoes are forbidden.

Please note that school shoes must be kept completely black and boots of any kind are not allowed.

Our uniform requirements are complemented by a smart appearance and as such, hair styles that should not have a distinct contrast in length. Hair that is dyed must be of a natural hair colour and may not contain more than one colour. To avoid a health and safety risk, long hair must not impede vision or cover the face, except for a fringe which must not cover the eyes. Long hair must be tied up for practical lessons. Religious head coverings must be black and securely tied for practical lessons. Hair bands or accessories must be for functional use to secure the hair. Where hairbands are worn they must be black. Headwear that has religious or cultural purpose should be black. The final decision as to whether a particular haircut/style is appropriate is at the discretion of senior staff.

Make up, nail varnish and jewellery are not permitted with the exception of one pair of plain stud earrings which may be worn in the lobe of the ear.

Students found to be wearing an inappropriate item of uniform may be asked to change this or in some cases parents/carers will be contacted and requested to bring replacement uniform to school.

We appreciate your support in ensuring that standards of uniform and appearance are maintained.

First Aid Information and Procedures

Medication; All medication should be handed into first aid and not carried by the students. Exception EpiPen, Asthma inhalers, insulin. Tranexamic acid in special circumstances.

Please make sure we have the correct medical information and emergency contact details, if you have changed your phone number or there is any change in medical conditions or concerns, please contact first aid using the enquiries email or the main school phone number.

Please send children into school with a water bottle they can re-fill at our water stations provided or they can purchase a drink from the school canteen.

Students with Asthma must carry with them their own personal inhalers. This includes offsite activities and school trips to ensure they can participate safely.

Parents/Carers of students with a known allergy must provide school first aid with antihistamine; this also applies to those with anaphylaxis in addition to their EpiPen.

We do not provide liquid paracetamol such as Calpol. If your child cannot take tablets and you would preder them to have liquid Calpol please send this in to the school first aider with your childs name on it, this will be kept safe in first aid for your child only.

First Aid and Mobile Phones

Students should not be contacting parents/carers when they feel unwell and requesting to be collected from school. If a student is unwell, they MUST go to the First Aider who will deal with them. If a student is not well enough to stay in school, the First Aider will contact parents/carers to arrange collection.

Students who contact their parents/carer directly and do not follow the procedures in place will be sanctioned, this may result in their mobile phone having to be handed in to the student services office each day. The use of anyone else's mobile phone risks that person being sanctioned also.

Please do not arrive at school to collect your child unless school have contacted you to do so. We do not have school staff readily available to collect children. Thank you for your support and cooperation.
