## Message from Mr McGurran, Senior Vice Principal

This month marked the 30th anniversary of the fall of the Berlin Wall. Some readers may well remember switching on their TVs in November 1989 to watch with dismay as East and West Berliners took to the streets with sledgehammers to remove a wall that had divided their communities for almost three decades. There was scenes of incredible emotion as friends and relatives who had not seen or spoken to each other for almost three decades hugged and kissed and renewed old acquaintances. Families were even reunited.

While it existed the Wall stood for division and intolerance. It was a symbol of what happens to societies when distrust and prejudice are allowed to flourish. But walls do not divide societies or communities. Even without walls they can be divided. Over the last three years our society has been divided over Brexit. Whether you support it or are against it, there can be little doubt that the division it has caused has been hugely damaging. It will be for politicians and citizens alike to repair this damage.

As a community of faith Bishop Challoner works hard to fight division and intolerance. We are guided by Gospel teachings to strive for equality, tolerance, justice and compassion. When Jesus told the story of the Good Samaritan he was reminding His followers that everyone is our neighbour. When He ate with tax collectors and helped the adulterous woman He was reminding us that there was nobody beyond redemption and that God loves and forgives everyone.

We live in a society where people, be it their fault or through no fault of their own, slip through the cracks and become homeless. There are people in our community who, while not homeless, struggle to pay the bills and put food on the table. A divided community might say these people

are not our problem but a united and compassionate community would hold true to the teachings of Jesus and view these people as our collective responsibility. As a faith community, committed to including all regardless of race, class, wealth or viewpoint, our duty, as a Catholic community, must be to support those less fortunate than ourselves. We have a proud tradition of supporting the less fortunate with our shoebox appeal. As we move into the season of advent the school intends to help those in our local community most in need of it.

The Trussell Trust does amazing work "helping local people in crisis." Starting on Monday 25th November they are starting food collections to support our most vulnerable. We are going to organize this collection on their behalf and would ask our students and families to support us by bring the following items into school where they can be spared. Food will be collected using the following:

- Milk Monday (UHT Milk please)
- Tins Tuesday (Custard, Macaroni cheese)
- Washday Wednesday (Washing powder/shower gel/ soap)
- Treats Thursday (Chocolate, Biscuits)
- Fruit Juice Friday.

We aim to deliver our collections to the food bank on Monday 7th December so that it can reach families in need before Christmas. It was Pope Francis who reminded Donald Trump when he wanted to build a wall between the USA and Mexico that compassionate communities build bridges, not walls.
