Uniform Standards

Footwear

The standards of uniform and presentation from our students since returning to school has been pleasing, on the whole students are smart and ready to learn.

You will see from the information on the website- www.bishopchalloner.org.uk/about/uniform that the following footwear is not allowed-



There are some students in school that have returned with footwear, either identical or similar. Boots of any kind are not allowed, irrelevant of whether they are branded or not. We fully appreciate the cost of replacing school uniform and footwear so if your child is wearing footwear that is not allowed, we are not expecting replacements to be sought immediately, but please ensure that they are replaced in time for the new half term on Monday 31st October 2022. Blazers/Jumpers

Royal blue jumpers for year 7-10 and maroon jumpers for year 11 are optional items of uniform. If students wear a jumper, they must still wear their blazer over the jumper. Blazers are not optional and jumpers must not be worn instead of a blazer.

No other items of clothing- sweatshirts/hoodies etc must be worn under blazers.



It is that time of year again when the latest (now seemingly annually) FIFA and Call of Duty hit the shelves just in time for Christmas. Firstly, the new Call of Duty Game, Call of Duty Modern Warfare 2 is rated 18 by PEGI. FIFA is rated as 3+. FIFA contains aspects of a 'loot box' mechanic through FIFA Ultimate Team, a process where real life and in-game currency can be exchanged for 'packs'. These packs contain digital cards of football players, stadiums, kits and more. Much like real trading card games, there is no guarantee of a rare player, and more often than not, 'common' players holding little value are obtained



Computer Science trip to San Francisco 2022

After two challenging years of school time and a long halt to school trips in July 2022 the dedicated staff of Bishop Challoner took a group of 51 students on a Computer Science trip to San Francisco and Silicon Valley. The trip was an amazing opportunity for the students to learn and experience a different culture which would help them to become global citizens.

The students visited landmarks including: Interactive Tech Museum, Computer History Museum, the Apple Store in Silicon Valley. They took trips to the Six Flags Discovery Kingdom, Stanford University where they had a tour of the university's campuses, they took a walk around the Googleplex and visited the Golden Gate Bridge

The students had the opportunity for some leisure time too spending evenings at Pier 39 followed by dinner at Bubba Gump restaurant. They had a guided tour of San Francisco and spent time shopping in Union Square and even went to Oracle Park the home to San Francisco Giants where they watched the team play against Arizona.

On the last day, the students visited Alcatraz Island. This was a historical and emotional experience since the island was also used by the native Indians during the freedom protest in the 1960s and early 1970s.
