A Prayer for the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord



Message from Mrs Nutt, Assistant Principal

Today is the feast day of Saint Blaise, a Catholic Bishop who was martyred in Armenia in the 4th century and who is revered as the patron of throat illnesses. This stems from the story that, as he was being led to his execution, a boy who was choking on a fishbone was brought to Saint Blaise. St Blaise was able to heal him and save him form imminent death. An invocation to St. Blaise and a special blessing, performed by holding two candles against the throat, remains is still practised in many parishes today.

Coincidently, whilst on the subject of our throats, yesterday was Time to Talk Day. Students and staff have been encouraged to talk opening about mental health as part of the wider spectrum of well-being and share their top tips for managing challenges.

Continuing this theme, next Tuesday 7th February is Safer Internet Day and this year's national focus is 'Want to talk about it? Making space for conversations about life online'. The UK Safer Internet Centre suggests parents and carers might want to open the conversation with young people in the following ways:

- What sites do you like to visit and what do you enjoy doing online?
- · What games do you and your friends like to play online?
- · How do you stay safe online?
- · What is OK and not OK to share?
- · Where to go for help?
- Where do you find the safety advice, privacy settings and how to report or block on the platforms you use?

Monday to Thursday: Start: 8.40am. Finish: 3.20pm Friday: Start: 8.40am. Finish: 2.30pm BeReal is an app launched in 2020 that rose quickly in popularity last year. Its main feature is a daily notification that encourages users to share a photo of themselves and their immediate surroundings given a randomly selected twominute window every day. The resulting media is a capture of both the front and rear facing camera on the device.



Why are we concerned as a school?

- A BeReal post could show a user's location, personal details such as school or workplaces.
- The app does not have an explicit image moderation process, and thus does not restrict the users from posting inappropriate photos.
- The minimum age to use BeReal is 13 although there is no formal verification process.
 - There are no privacy features.
- · Anxiety of not sharing or sharing something seen as 'boring'.
- · Comparision and competition amongst peers.

Uniform Standards

Students are required to wear the standard uniform of blazer, tie, white/blue shirt with black straight leg school trousers (not skinny or boot cut) or girls can wear a knee length black school skirt (not lycra or stretchy). Girls are also reminded that if they choose to wear a skirt, then they should wear plain, black, opague tights. Students are reminded that black leather school shoes should be worn and that trainers/trainer style shoes are forbidden.

Please note that school shoes must be kept completely black and boots of any kind are not allowed.

In order to complement the smart school uniform we insist that students' hair is smart in appearance and that students do not have shaved/razored hair styles or lines/ patterns shaved into the hair. Extreme changes of hair colour are also not permitted. The final decision as to whether a particular haircut/style is appropriate is at the discretion of senior staff. Braids are allowed.



Make up, nail varnish and jewellery are not permitted with the exception of one pair of plain stud earrings which may be worn.

Please note that lycra or stretchy skirts are not allowed to be worn. Students found to be wearing an inappropriate item of uniform may be asked to change this or in some cases parents/carers will be contacted and requested to bring replacement uniform to school.

We appreciate your support in ensuring that standards of uniform and appearance are maintained.
