# **Uniform Standards**

Students are required to wear the standard uniform of blazer, tie, white/blue shirt with black straight leg school trousers (not skinny or boot cut) or girls can wear a knee length black school skirt (not lycra or stretchy). Girls are also reminded that if they choose to wear a skirt, then they should wear plain, black, opaque tights. Students are reminded that black leather school shoes should be worn and that trainers/trainer style shoes are for<u>bidden</u>.

Please note that school shoes must be kept completely black and boots of any kind are not allowed.

In order to complement the smart school uniform we insist that students' hair is smart in appearance and that students do not have shaved/razored hair styles or lines/ patterns shaved into the hair. Extreme changes of hair colour are also not permitted. The final decision as to whether a particular haircut/style is appropriate is at the discretion of senior staff. Make up, nail varnish and jewellery are not permitted with the exception of one pair of plain stud earrings which may be worn.

Please note that lycra or stretchy skirts are not allowed to be worn. Students found to be wearing an inappropriate item of uniform may be asked to change this or in some cases parents/carers will be contacted and requested to bring replacement uniform to school.

With all the sparkle, it's easy to forget that fireworks can be dangerous if not used correctly and responsibly. This advice will help everyone to stay safe while celebrating.

# Using fireworks at home?

If you decide to use freeorks at home, here's how everyone can stay safe.

#### Only buy from licensed sellers

Check before you buy. Make sure you buy fineworks from a licensed retails, both in-store and online. Do not buy fineworks from unknown retailers on social media sites. It's liegal for anyone under 18 to buy or carry fineworks.

#### Store fireworks safely

Store freeworks in their original packaging. Lock them away from children and animals. Keep freeworks dry and away from sources of heat or ignition.

#### **Check your timings**

Did you know that you can't let fineworks off between 11pm and 7am? The only exceptions are Fineworks Night, when the cut-off is midnight, and Dhwill, New Year's Eve and Othese New Year, when it's 1am. Timings may be different in Scotland. Search 'tireworks' on gov.scot for more achice.



# Look after pets

Be considerate

People and animals may be affected by freworks. Let your

neighbours know in advance if

Cats and dogs should stay inside. Give small animals who live outside lots of extra bedding and nesting material to burtow in.

#### Read all the instructions

The box of freworks will tell you important things like how far away people need to stand back once the frework is lit, if you don't understand the instructions and warrings, don't use the frework.

#### Dispose of fireworks safely

Ensure that freworks are out, soak them in water overhight, then put them in a rubbish bag and in the bin.
