## Message from Mr Hetherton, Senior Vice Principal Friday 5th November 2021

Welcome to the first edition of BC14 this half term and to the month of November – a period of remembrance and a time that we can give thanks to God our Father for all of our loved ones who have gone before us. The month of November falls during the liturgical season known as Ordinary Time – a season represented by the liturgical colour green. In this context green represents a symbol of hope and the colour of the sprouting seed and new beginnings.

Although November can bring with it a sense of real sadness, in remembering the past, we can also be encouraged to embrace the present and, similar to the sprouting seed, look forward to new beginnings with a renewed sense of hope, optimism and faith. 
