#### **Sports Results**

It's been a brilliant couple of weeks of football, with several fantastic performances in both league and cup competitions. Our under 13 and under 15 girls' teams were both victorious in league matches away at Lordswood. Chanel C hit six as the U13's ran out 14-1 winners, while a Suraya H winner secured a 5-4 victory and all three points for the U15's.

In the Birmingham Cup, Year 7 boys put in an impressive performance in difficult conditions at John Henry Newman CC; a Terrance B hat-trick ensured progression to round 2 after a 10-1 victory. Year 8 boys are safely through to round 2 after a much closer 4-2 win over Tudor Grange, Year 9 progressed after an 8-0 victory over St Thomas Aquinas and Year 11 boys advanced to the second round after beating Ark Kings Academy 13-1.

## Extra space between letters helps children read faster and make fewer mistakes, study finds

Children's reading speed can be improved by simply increasing the space between letters within a piece of text, research has found. A study by Anglia Ruskin University looked at the benefits of letter spacing and coloured overlays among a group of dyslexic and non-dyslexic children. It discovered that text with increased space between each letter provided a benefit to both groups. On average, the dyslexia group showed a 13 per cent increase in reading speed, while the non-dyslexic children showed a 5 per cent increase. See
