What could this qualification lead to?

This qualification is the main focus of a two-year study programme of learning and is equivalent to one A Level, meaning that learners will receive a broad basis of study for the HSC sector.

The **Health and Social Care** qualification is intended to carry UCAS points and is recognised by higher education providers as contributing to meeting admission requirements to many relevant courses, for example:

- BSc (Hons) in Nursing
- BA (Hons) in Social Work
- BSc (Hons) in Physiotherapy
- BSc (Hons) in Occupational Therapy
- BSc (Hons) in Speech Therapy
- BA (Hons) in Health and Social Care.

This pathway is 360 GLH. The externally assessed units are worth 58% and the internally assessed units 42% of the total grade awarded which will be one of the following:

- ✓ Unclassified [U]
- ✓ Pass [P]
- ✓ Merit [M]
- ✓ Distinction [D]
- ✓ Distinction Star [D*]

How is the course assessed?

The course is made up of 4 units, two of which are external exams. You will also complete course work for which you will receive a grade of either Distinction, Merit or Pass level in each assignment. These grades convert into UCAS points for entry into University.



This course is delivered at 9 hours over the two week timetable run over two years. You will also be expected to complete independent study time.

At the end of the two years, depending on your commitment, you could walk away with a Distinction which is equivalent to 'A' Level 'A'.
