Year 10 February Half Term Newsletter 2020

Dear Parent/Carer,

Year 10 have continued to excel in the second term of their GCSE careers. Students have completed mock examinations and assessments in classes which have produced very promising results. Students' organisation of their own time, therefore, is becoming increasingly important in the build up to their external GCSE examinations. It is important that they commence in independent revision to solidify their learning given their examinations will question the work they are currently doing at the end of year 11. As such, I would recommend students create flashcards of the topics they study. One side could have a question, the other side potential answers. In English, one side could have a quotation and some analysis from their text, the other side a picture. These techniques really aid retention of information. Another technique students could utilise in their revision is by creating mindmaps which link together the different strands of their knowledge. This will enable them to review what they have learnt whilst cognitively linking the information. Official revision guides are available in school and class teachers will happily direct students to the best revision techniques for their own topics. By creating excellent revision resources as they go along, students will have the best opportunities in their GCSEs.

Work Experience

Year 10 is very significant for students due to the work experience component of it. It is pivotal that you and your child are discussing ideas and trying to arrange a placement as soon as possible as the skills it teaches students are invaluable. I would highly recommend arranging placements at the earliest convenience. If students are struggling, they are very welcome to see Mrs Reynolds who coordinates work experience. Those going on the trip to Germany will still have one week to partake in a work experience placement and they must make the most of this opportunity. It would be ideal for work experience forms to be handed in as soon as possible.

Extra-Curricular

There are many exciting opportunities for Year 10 to get involved with. Some of our students will be partaking in a programme with the University of Birmingham, Birmingham City University and Aston University in the prestigious AimHigher programme which has the aim of increasing ambition in students to help enable the best outcomes for them in the future. In the same vain, students have all had a talk about the opportunity to go to University summer schools for students their ages. I would highly recommend all students further research this as a taster for what university could be like in many different fields.

Soli House

With regards to Catholic life, students in Year 10 have the exciting opportunity to go on a residential trip to Soli House. This residential is an exciting opportunity for students to meet students from other schools of the same age. They will partake in myriad exciting activities which will both give them more insight into their own faith whilst being an enjoyable, holistic experience. Uniform and Appearance

Students are required to wear the standard uniform of blazer, tie, white/blue shirt with black straight leg school trousers (not skinny or boot cut) or girls can wear a knee length black school skirt. Girls are also reminded that if they choose to wear a skirt, then they should wear plain, black, opaque tights. Students are reminded that black leather school shoes should be worn and that trainers/trainer style shoes and boots are forbidden.

Please note that school shoes must be kept completely black. There are a number of styles, particularly for girls, currently in fashion with wood style soles. These are not suitable for school. School shoes should also be leather and not patent.

In order to complement the smart school uniform we insist that students' hair is smart in appearance and that students do not have shaved/razored hair styles or lines/patterns shaved into the hair. Extreme changes of hair colour are also not permitted. The final decision as to whether a particular haircut/style is appropriate is at the discretion of senior staff.

Make up, nail varnish and jewellery are not permitted with the exception of one pair of stud earrings which may be worn by girls.

Mobile Phones

With most students in school now owning mobile phones for use to and from school, it is important that they are also not a distraction to study. Students found with mobile phones during lessons and around the school will have them confiscated and they will be returned at the discretion of senior staff/Heads of Year. In more persistent cases, phones may only be returned to parents/carers.

This is very pleasing and is in line with the school attendance target. We hope that this level of attendance can continue throughout the remainder of the year.

If a student's attendance is 95%, this means they have missed fifty possible lessons, a significant amount during a school year. Students must endeavour, where possible to be in school, on time, every day and we will await the excellent results that all their hard work shall result in.

If your child is absent from school, a notification phone call needs to be made to the school on the first day of the absence and every further day that they are absent too. Upon return to school, a written note needs to be handed in to their form tutor, stating the reason for absence. Please encourage your child to be at school by 8.30am to instil the important life skill of good punctuality.
