WHAT IS UNIFEST?

UniFest Summer Schools take place at 6 universities across the West Midlands. UniFest gives you the chance to spend time exploring university life, meeting students and staff, making friends and having an action packed, fun experience!

WHO IS UNIFEST FOR?

UniFest is for students in Year 10 at state-funded secondary schools in the West Midlands who are from backgrounds and communities that are less likely to be considering university as an option. To apply for a place, you will need the support of your school and the consent of your parents or carers, and you should be able to answer "Yes" to at least one of the following:

•My parents or carers did not go to university

- •I receive Free School Meals
- •I have a disability or learning difficulty
- •I am in the care of my local authority
- •I am a young carer
- •I live in an area where not many young people go to university

WHAT WILL I DO?

That depends on which UniFest event you choose! Some explore university life and study in general and others focus on certain career or study options. All UniFest events include lots of hands-on sessions, and a packed programme of fun social activities!

WHAT'S THE CATCH?

There is no catch. UniFest is funded by universities and schools **and is totally free of charge**. For residential UniFest events, meals, accommodation and activities are all paid for (although you may want to bring a little pocket money with you). The universities will help you plan how to get to and from events.

Follow multiple patients over a 6-month period, as they go from their initial injury to recovery. It is amazing how many different healthcare professionals are involved in a patient's care. This incredible opportunity showcases a variety of professionals in one day. It gives students a chance to see them in action in various settings from the ward to the community. It is also a fantastic opportunity to see them work together in a multidisciplinary team.

During the work experience day, students will follow 2 patients from their initial presentation to recovery. Students will observe the healthcare professionals as they interact with the patients and and also each other. Students will have an opportunity to ask questions and gain knowledge through teaching. This will help students to make an informed career decision as well as learn about how healthcare professionals work together as part of a multidisciplinary team. Each work experience day is completely different and students will be able to build on their knowledge of NHS careers as they see different patient cases and their healthcare professionals work in a variety of settings, such as hospital and community. For this reason we recommend that students attend one work experience a month for 6 months to not only gain a deeper knowledge of multidisciplinary teams in general but also their chosen careers.

Pathway to STEM is an 18-month programme that empowers eligible Year 12 students to achieve their goal of studying STEM courses at University. Students on the scheme receive the following benefits:

•Residential summer school

- •E-mentoring
- •UCAS and personal statement support
- •Study skills support
- •A contextual offer

This sustained programme of activity aims to raise students' aspirations, improve their motivation to progress onto Higher Education and provides them with the knowledge, skills and experiences that will enhance their UCAS application, Students must have support from their teachers to apply, including approval for time off school/college where necessary to attend events.

Who is the Pathway for?

Places on our Pathway are open to Year 12 students who have the potential to enter higher education and are considering a degree in Technology, Engineering and Maths and the Physical Sciences. Please note, this Pathway does not cover Medicine and Healthcare courses as these subjects are covered in our Pathway to Healthcare programme. Please not that places on the programme are limited. If the programme is oversubscribed then places will be offered by random allocation to all eligible applicants until the programme is full. Those students who are not on the standard programme will be offered a flexible programme of activities that covers the information, advice and guidance provided by the standard programme but without a residential summer school and e-mentoring. Students who are interested in applying must meet the eligibility criteria as below.

Applications must be submitted by 5pm on Friday 4th March. Any applications submitted after this time and date will not be considered.

- It is a ten month programme which starts with paid work experience in the summer or Easter3 .
- A mentor will support you throughout the programme to advise you on one of the biggest career choices you will make the first step in your working life.

- You will gain a wide variety of transferable skills to give you a head start in your career.
- Smart Futures is accredited by the Institute of Leadership and Management (ILM) which looks great at your CV and at interview.



What is Smart Futures Professional Services?

- It is a two year programme which starts with paid work experience and employability skills training during school holidays.
- You will learn about the professional services industry and receive opportunities to practice your networking skills.
- You will gain a wide variety of transferable skills, giving you a head start on learning more about successfully securing a job in the professional services industry.
- A mentor will support you for up to 24 months and advise you as you take the first step in your working life – helping you with application and recruitment processes as well as providing ongoing support.

- You will also be invited to a series of events throughout your final school year to further build your skills and experience.
