About the summer schools

Our Summer Schools offer participants a real insight into life at a competitive, research intensive university. Each Summer School is different, but they all usually involve staying in our halls of residence, attending academic taster sessions, social activities and experiencing the campus's sports facilities. Participants also have the opportunity to meet current Warwick students during our Summer Schools.

The University of Warwick Outreach team have been holding Summer Schools for UK students from non-traditional backgrounds since 2012. In 2019, we welcomed over four hundred students aged between 15 and 18 years old on to our campus and we held our first online summer school for 16-17 year olds in 2020.

Warwick Summer Schools usually take place during July and August; and applications open in January 2022.

About the programme

The University of Warwick is committed to working with young people to maximise their academic potential. We are offering Year 13 students on our access programmes and predicted to achieve between A* to C grades the opportunity to participate in a free three day A Level Revision Bootcamp during the Easter holidays.

Participants will learn, revise and study one subject area intensively, with the chance to review progress through assessments and 1-2-1 feedback. We aim to provide a packed timetable, which will be constructive, valuable and enjoyable. Each day will be hosted at the University of Warwick, but sessions will be delivered by qualified teachers with vast experience in their subject areas.

There will also be an opportunity to explore effective study skills, exam technique and develop strategies in preparing for exams. In 2022, we are hoping and planning to deliver the Revision bootcamp in person on our campus.



Discover Warwick

Our 'Discover Warwick Week' is a great opportunity for you to explore what it would be like to be a student at Warwick.

Academic Taster Sessions

During the week, you can access pre-recorded lectures across a range of subject areas, designed to give you a mini-flavour of what studying a particular subject is like here at Warwick. You will also get to see how different subjects link to each other and discover some of our more niche subject areas. To give as real an experience as possible, the lectures will be followed up with a live session with our academics and current Warwick students.

Information, Advice and Guidance

Our week kicks off with a number of sessions to help you navigate your way through the process of choosing a course and university; understanding student finance; learning the steps required in applying for a university place; looking at alternative pathways (e.g., Degree Apprenticeships) amongst other.

Coming to university isn't *just* about studying for your degree - during the week, there will be plenty of opportunities for you to chat with current Warwick students about their experiences, and what they get up to in their spare time.

1. Smart Start

Smart Start provides high-quality work experience in the world of business



Through a five-day programme of workshops and group tasks, Smart Start offers a prestigious route to gaining skills and experience highly valued by employers and education providers alike. Beyond the week, participants benefit from support with university applications, mentoring, the chance to apply for a bursary and employability support whilst at university.

Since its launch in 2009, Smart Start has supported more than 1,569 young people, won multiple awards and gained accreditation from City & Guilds and Skills Builder.

Smart Start 2022 will take place at the A&O London office in the week commencing 18 July. All successful applicants are required to attend a mock assessment day at the A&O London Office on Wednesday 25 or Tuesday 31 May. "After hearing and speaking to lawyers and volunteers from A&O, a career in law seems more achievable. I know what to expect and how to go through the process and take things step-by-step."

2. Smart Applications

Smart Applications is a separate, virtual programme which ensures those who cannot or do not want to travel to London do not miss out on gaining real insight into the world of work.

Taking place across 8 webinars in June and July 2022, participants will gain interview experience, network with employees and develop valuable employability skills, alongside support with university and apprenticeship applications.

How to apply

Year 12s are able to apply for one or both programmes through the same application process. Successful applicants will take part in either Smart Start or Smart Applications - you cannot attend both.

To be considered, you must meet Allen & Overy's eligibility requirements.

Anyone wishing to apply must attend a virtual <u>Smart Choices event</u> in March/April 2022, which will provide support on the next steps and help you develop strategies that lay the foundation for a successful career. You can register <u>here</u>.

WORK EXPERIENCE OPPORT

We are excited to announce that the largest free national work programme for your aspiring medical, dental and veterinary students has retained this was developed last year in partnership with Birmingham Universities Hose Trust and it is free for students from 10-13 or S3-S6 year groups to participate in. We took a small break from the virtual work experience programme in November to convert the LIVE teaching into E-learning courses that students can now complete in their own time. Students have 1 month to complete each session, and once they have completed the programme they will receive a certificate from Medic Mentor and UHB as evidence of their participation. Medical Schools are accepting virtual work experience as an alternative to in-person work experience in light of the pandemic and reduced access to placements.


Participation in the virtual work experience will also provide students (and their parents) with several opportunities to speak to doctors, dentists and vets continuously throughout the academic year. They will be able to do this on Tuesday evenings and most weekends, for free. They can also call the Mentor Helpline number 01530 417 299 from 10am-5pm Mon-Fri if they would like to advice on careers or applying to medical, dental, vet school. Mostly this number is manned by Doctors. Medic Mentor is a non-profit social enterprise and all of our proceeds are reinvested in supporting students to make informed career decisions.



WHAT IS UNIFEST?

UniFest Summer Schools take place at 6 universities across the West Midlands. UniFest gives you the chance to spend time exploring university life, meeting students and staff, making friends and having an action packed, fun experience!

WHO IS UNIFEST FOR?

UniFest is for students in Year 10 at state-funded secondary schools in the West Midlands who are from backgrounds and communities that are less likely to be considering university as an option. To apply for a place, you will need the support of your school and the consent of your parents or carers, and you should be able to answer "Yes" to at least one of the following:

- •My parents or carers did not go to university
- •I receive Free School Meals
- •I have a disability or learning difficulty
- •I am in the care of my local authority
- •I am a young carer
- •I live in an area where not many young people go to university

WHAT WILL I DO?

That depends on which UniFest event you choose! Some explore university life and study in general and others focus on certain career or study options. All UniFest events include lots of hands-on sessions, and a packed programme of fun social activities!

WHAT'S THE CATCH?

There is no catch. UniFest is funded by universities and schools **and is totally free of charge**. For residential UniFest events, meals, accommodation and activities are all paid for (although you may want to bring a little pocket money with you). The universities will help you plan how to get to and from events.

Follow multiple patients over a 6-month period, as they go from their initial injury to recovery. It is amazing how many different healthcare professionals are involved in a patient's care. This incredible opportunity showcases a variety of professionals in one day. It gives students a chance to see them in action in various settings from the ward to the community. It is also a fantastic opportunity to see them work together in a multidisciplinary team

During the work experience day, students will follow 2 patients from their initial presentation to recovery. Students will observe the healthcare professionals as they interact with the patients and and also each other. Students will have an opportunity to ask questions and gain knowledge through teaching. This will help students to make an informed career decision as well as learn about how healthcare professionals work together as part of a multidisciplinary team. Each work experience day is completely different and students will be able to build on their knowledge of NHS careers as they see different patient cases and their healthcare professionals work in a variety of settings, such as hospital and community. For this reason we recommend that students attend one work experience a month for 6 months to not only gain a deeper knowledge of multidisciplinary teams in general but also their chosen careers.



Pathway to STEM is an 18-month programme that empowers eligible Year 12 students to achieve their goal of studying STEM courses at University. Students on the scheme receive the following benefits:

- Residential summer school

- UCAS and personal statement support

- A contextual offer

This sustained programme of activity aims to raise students' aspirations, improve their motivation to progress onto Higher Education and provides them with the knowledge, skills and experiences that will enhance their UCAS application, Students must have support from their teachers to apply, including approval for time off school/college where necessary to attend events.

Who is the Pathway for?

Places on our Pathway are open to Year 12 students who have the potential to enter higher education and are considering a degree in Technology, Engineering and Maths and the Physical Sciences. Please note, this Pathway does not cover Medicine and Healthcare courses as these subjects are covered in our Pathway to Healthcare programme. Please not that places on the programme are limited. If the programme is oversubscribed then places will be offered by random allocation to all eligible applicants until the programme is full. Those students who are not on the standard programme will be offered a flexible programme of activities that covers the information, advice and guidance provided by the standard programme but without a residential summer school and e-mentoring. Students who are interested in applying must meet the eligibility criteria as below.

Applications must be submitted by 5pm on Friday 4th March. Any applications submitted after this time and date will not be considered.




What is Smart Futures Professional Services?






