### WORK EXPERIENCE How to find a placement

Do you know the type of work experience you would like to do?

If yes, follow these steps...

Do you know anyone who works in the area of work you are interested in? (This could be family members, or Friends of the Family, neighbours or Friends' parents etc.)

If yes, ask them if the organisation they work for could offer you a work experience placement.

> If successful go to Step 5. If unsuccessful go to Step 2.

If no, follow these steps...

Let your Head of Year know ASAP so that we can organise a workshop for you in the Library where we can discuss ideas.


When you have decided what type of work experience you want to do go to Step 2.

### Go onto www.yell.co.uk

Insert the area you are interested in e.g. computer software and YOUR postcode then hit search.

Use the Contact Details provided

Use the contact details provided on this list to either call or e-mail the company to ask them if they can offer you a placement. (You may need to go onto the company's website to find their e-mail or phone number).







### Call them

This is the most direct way of getting hold of someone at the company. When you call, you should:

- Ask to speak to someone about work experience
- Tell them your name, what school you go to and when the work experience dates are (4th July-8th July 2022)
- Tell them that you have a real interest in this kind of work and would be grateful for an opportunity to get some insight into it by doing some work experience with
- Be prepared to give them your e-mail address or phone number for them to contact you on.

### Email them

This is not as quick and not as effective as phone call because an e-mail can be ignored more easily, but if you really can't bring yourself to make a call, send them an e-mail which should include:




- Who you are
  - What kind of role you're looking for
- Your overall career goals (and why this position would help)
  - Your skills (or previous experience, if you have any)

Complete the Work Experience Form

Complete the Work Experience Form outlining where you're going (with your parents/carers signature) and hand it in to Mrs Newton in the Library. Once the Health and Safety checks have been done on your placement, it can go ahead.








### Completely Unique Experience

Follow multiple patients over a 6-month period, as they go from their initial injury to recovery. It is amazing how many different healthcare professionals are involved in a patient's care. This incredible opportunity showcases a variety of professionals in one day. It gives students a chance to see them in action in various settings from the ward to the community. It is also a fantastic opportunity to see them work together in a multidisciplinary

During the work experience day, students will follow 2 patients from their initial presentation to recovery. Students will observe the healthcare professionals as they interact with the patients and and also each other. Students will have an opportunity to ask questions and gain knowledge through teaching. This will help students to make an informed career decision as well as learn about how healthcare professionals work together as part of a multidisciplinary team. Each work experience day is completely different and students will be able to build on their knowledge of NHS careers as they see different patient cases and their healthcare professionals work in a variety of settings, such as hospital and community. For this reason we recommend that students attend one work experience a month for 6 months to not only gain a deeper knowledge of multidisciplinary teams in general but also their chosen careers.

Allied Healthcare Mentor are committed to ensuring that students still have the opportunity to gain valuable insight into healthcare careers, even in these difficult times.





### WORK EXPERIENCE OPPORT

We are excited to announce that the largest free national work programme for your aspiring medical, dental and veterinary students has retained this was developed last year in partnership with Birmingham Universities Hose Trust and it is free for students from 10-13 or S3-S6 year groups to participate in. We took a small break from the virtual work experience programme in November to convert the LIVE teaching into E-learning courses that students can now complete in their own time. Students have 1 month to complete each session, and once they have completed the programme they will receive a certificate from Medic Mentor and UHB as evidence of their participation. Medical Schools are accepting virtual work experience as an alternative to in-person work experience in light of the pandemic and reduced access to placements.


Participation in the virtual work experience will also provide students (and their parents) with several opportunities to speak to doctors, dentists and vets continuously throughout the academic year. They will be able to do this on Tuesday evenings and most weekends, for free. They can also call the Mentor Helpline number 01530 417 299 from 10am-5pm Mon-Fri if they would like to advice on careers or applying to medical, dental, vet school. Mostly this number is manned by Doctors. Medic Mentor is a non-profit social enterprise and all of our proceeds are reinvested in supporting students to make informed career decisions.

### Rise and shine

Starting your revision by 9am will help you get into a routine that you can stick to.



### **Breakfast**

Having breakfast before revising is vital as it helps you to concentrate for longer.




### Log off

Switch off all devices, a five minute peek at Facebook turns into an hour so easily. Use internet time as a reward on a break.



### Past papers

Past exam papers are a perfect way to get used to exam pressure. Time yourself and use past papers to improve your confidence.



### Get colourful

Keep your notes organised and bright. Use different fonts, pens and diagrams. Colour coding your areas also helps.



### Stick to the plan

Make a revision timetable, it will help you prioritise your areas. Plan for different ways of learning (mind maps, essays, fact cards)



### Take breaks

Take a short break (5-10 minutes) after every half hour - It's important to get away from your work area. Adding breaks into your timetable is vital.

### Teach

If you are confident with a subject, teach it to your friends and they can do the same for you.

### No last minute revision

Cramming 10 minutes before an exam doesn't work, planning your time and working hard does!

### Ways to STOP Panic Taking Over During an Exam

- 1 TAKE SOME DEEP BREATHS
  - This will help clear your head and give you time to think.
- 2. RE-READ THE QUESTION
  - This will help ensure you don't misread the question and avoid making sloppy mistakes.
- 3. THINK BACK TO YOUR REVISION
  Have you answered similar questions previously during your revision?
- 4. WHAT WOULD YOUR TEACHER SAY?
  What advice would your teacher give you to help you right now?
- SOMETHING IS BETTER THAN NOTHING
   Better to guess the answer than leave it blank. If you don't write anything down you are guaranteed to get zero marks.
- STICK TO YOUR EXAM STRATEGY
   If you have a bad first question, stick to your pre-planned strategy and don't let the bad start affect your performance on the next question.
- 7. DON'T PUT TOO MUCH PRESSURE ON YOURSELF Work your hardest and do your best. Some stress is good but becoming too stressed doesn't help you think clearly under pressure.

- Understand that stress is a natural response to a challenge
- Pay attention to your thoughts and emotions with kindness
- Transform your anxiety into actions you can take to meet the challenge

### fighting for young people's mental health

It is normal to feel a bit worried about exams, especially if you're under pressure from school or family. Exam stress can cause you to feel <u>anxious</u> or <u>depressed</u>, and this might affect your <u>sleeping</u> or <u>eating habits</u>.

### Be kind to yourself

Think about all the things you have achieved so far. It can be helpful to write a list of all the things you like about yourself, and the things other people value about you too.

If people around you - like your parents or family - are putting pressure on you, it can help to tell them what you feel able to achieve, and let them know that your expectations are different to theirs. You could also talk to a teacher you trust about the pressure you are under at home.





Earn, learn and make a difference with an NHS apprenticeship. Our apprenticeships offer routes into many of the more than 350 NHS careers through a mix of on-the-job training and classroom learning.

### What you need to know about NHS apprenticeships

- •if you are aged 16 to 18 or 19+ and in your first year of an apprenticeship, the minimum you should receive is £4.30 an hour (the National Minimum Wage for apprentices)
- •many NHS employers will pay you more than the minimum wage
- •they take between one and five years to complete
- •anyone over the age of 16 can do one
- •you're likely to spend four days on work placement and one day or at a training centre or college
- •you'll develop your skills, including English and maths
- you'll gain a competence qualification (based on what you can do in the workplace) and a knowledge qualification, or a qualification combining both




