Green jobs are roles that contribute to preserving or restoring the environment and our planet. You could be working in a traditional sector such as manufacturing or construction, or in a new, emerging green industry such as renewable energy and energy efficiency.



### WHAT DO WE MEAN BY GREEN JOBS

As the UK economy becomes greener, some industries need help adapting their products and processes to reduce their emissions. Others are working on green technology, for example electric vehicles and LED lighting. Some are discovering completely new green activities to tackle climate change.

All of this is creating exciting new job opportunities.
A green job is perfect if you enjoy being active, working behind the scenes and seek a varied but rewarding role.

# How to get an environmental job

While an environmental science degree is a common route into the sector it isn't the only path. Explore the routes you can take to an environmental career that best suits your skills.

# Do I need a related environmental degree?

Entry into some occupations, such as land-based engineering, is only possible with a specific degree. For other careers, including environmental management or conservation, you'll need to study a relevant environmental degree. Discover what you can do with an environmental science degree.

# Ambition: 16-18 Applications for Ambition Nottingham 16-18 are now open, the deadline to apply is the 27th November 2022.

Ambition is a **free**, two-year scheme for all **Year 12 students and Year 1 vocational students** from anywhere in the UK. The programme takes place online although there may be an opportunity to visit campus at some point during the programme.

The activities support progression and application to a university of your choice. **Examples of past activities:**





# **NHS** apprenticeships

Earn, learn and make a difference with an NHS apprenticeship. Our apprenticeships offer routes into many of the more than 350 NHS careers through a mix of on-the-job training and classroom learning.

## What you need to know about NHS apprenticeships

- •if you are aged 16 to 18 or 19+ and in your first year of an apprenticeship, the minimum you should receive is £4.30 an hour (the National Minimum Wage for apprentices)
- •many NHS employers will pay you more than the minimum wage
- •they take between one and five years to complete
- anyone over the age of 16 can do one
- you're likely to spend four days on work placement and one day or at a training centre or college
- •you'll develop your skills, including English and maths
- •you'll gain a competence qualification (based on what you can do in the workplace) and a knowledge qualification, or a qualification combining both


