Leeds Futures




Leeds Futures is a national outreach programme designed for individual learners in Year 12 / Year 1. It provides students with the opportunity to learn more about a subject area they are interested in pursuing at university, whilst developing their study skills and careers awareness.

Students enrolling on the programme choose to specialise in a particular subject area. They will then attend a variety of subject-related activities alongside receiving advice and guidance on practical matters such as UCAS applications, accommodation choices and student finance.

This programme is ideal for students who have a clear idea of what subject they are interested in studying at university and have a preference for mainly online sessions with at least one on campus visit held at the University of Leeds.



What is UniFest?

UniFest is our Year 10 summer school which offers you the chance to explore university life, meet current university students and staff and make new friends. With five summer school events to choose from at different universities across the West Midlands, you will have an action-packed, fun experience.

Who is UniFest for?

UniFest is for learners in Year 10 at non-selective, state-funded secondary schools in the West Midlands who are from backgrounds and communities that are less likely to consider university as an option. To apply for a place, you will need the support of your school and the consent of your parents or carers, and you should be able to answer "Yes" to at least one of the following:

- •I live in an area where not many young people go to university
- •I am a young carer
- •I have a disability or learning difficulty
- •I am in the care of my local authority
- •I receive Free School Meals /FSM6/ Pupil Premium
- •My parents or carers did not go to university

What will I do?

That depends on which UniFest event you choose! Some events explore university life and study in general, and others focus on specific careers or study options. All UniFest events include lots of hands-on sessions and a fun programme of social activities.

Is UniFest free?

Yes! UniFest is funded by universities and schools and is **totally free of charge**. For residential UniFest events, meals, accommodation and activities are all paid for (although you may want to bring a little pocket money with you). The universities will help you plan how to get to and from events. If travel costs will make it difficult for you to attend, please get in touch by emailing aimhigher@contacts.bham.ac.uk.


What happens if there are more applicants than places?

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

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Access to Birmingham

The Access to Birmingham (A2B) programme helps University of Birmingham applicants with little or no higher education experience to explore what studying at university involves.

The University of Birmingham has a long history of welcoming students from a wide variety of social and cultural backgrounds. We were one of the first universities to set up a fair access scheme for local students in 2000 and are proud to be able to offer you the support of our A2B scheme if you are studying at one of our partner institutions.

Apply to A2B

Applications for the 2025/26 A2B scheme are open until 13 November 2025 for Medicine and Dentistry and 12 February 2026 fir all other applicants. Completing the programme will bring you a range of benefits including an alternative offer and funding. We encourage you to explore our programme information and eligibility and consider applying.

Benefits of taking part in the programme

Once you complete A2B successfully, you will receive two offers from the University of Birmingham, the standard offer and a <u>Pathways to Birmingham offer</u>.

The Pathways to Birmingham offer is typically a reduction of up to two A level grades (e.g. BBB rather than AAB).

As well as the Pathways to Birmingham offer, you will also benefit from:

- Financial support
- •Continued support and guidance from an experienced and dedicated A2B team
- •Preparation for the transition from school to university study
- •The opportunity to make new friends at a special induction event before you start university
- •Becoming a Birmingham Scholar upon starting university
- •Practice interviews for courses where relevant (Medicine, Dentistry, Social Work, Nursing, and Physiotherapy)
