

A quick guide

Entry Requirements

The entry guidance below outlines the grades we expect students to have achieved to demonstrate their suitability for the course.

If you narrowly miss these grades, we will consider additional evidence on a case-by-case basis.

Art & Design	Minimum grade 6 in Art
Biology	Minimum grade 7 in Biology OR Minimum grade 77 in Combined Science Minimum grade 6 in Mathematics
Business	Minimum grade 6 in Business
Chemistry	Minimum grade 7 in Chemistry OR Minimum grade 77 in Combined Science Minimum grade 6 in Mathematics
Computer Science	Minimum grade 6 in Computing
Core Maths	Minimum grade 5 in Mathematics
Economics	Minimum grade 6 in English and Mathematics
English literature	Minimum grade 6 in English
Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)	Minimum of 5 GCSE's grade 4 and above. Students must manage their own time and meet deadlines.
French	Minimum grade 6 in French
Further Maths	Minimum grade 8 in Mathematics
Geography	Minimum grade 6 in Geography
History	Minimum grade 6 in History
Law	Minimum grade 6 in English
Mathematics	Minimum grade 7 in Mathematics
Media studies	Minimum grade 6 in either of the following: Media Studies English Language or Literature Either History or Geography
Philosophy and Ethics	Minimum grade 6 in Religious Studies
Physical Education	Minimum grade 6 in PE
Physics	Minimum grade 7 in Physics OR Minimum grade 77 in Combined Science Minimum grade 7 in Mathematics
Psychology	Minimum grade 6 in Biology, English and Mathematics OR Minimum grade 65 in Combined Science
Sociology	Minimum grade 6 in English Language or Literature
Level 3 Business	Minimum of 5 GCSE's at grade 4 and above (ideally to include both English and Mathematics)
Level 3 Criminology	Minimum grade 5 in English Language or Literature
Level 3 Health and Social Care	Minimum of 5 GCSE's at grade 4 and above (ideally to include both English and Mathematics)
Level 3 Sport	Minimum of 5 GCSE's at grade 4 and above (ideally to include both English and Mathematics)




Time to Think



Joining the **National Saturday Club** is a unique opportunity to learn new skills, discover talents, meet new people, and find out more about further education, higher education and rewarding careers.







Access to Birmingham

The Access to Birmingham (A2B) programme helps University of Birmingham applicants with little or no higher education experience to explore what studying at university involves.

The University of Birmingham has a long history of welcoming students from a wide variety of social and cultural backgrounds. We were one of the first universities to set up a fair access scheme for local students in 2000 and are proud to be able to offer you the support of our A2B scheme if you are studying at one of our partner institutions.

Apply to A2B

Applications for the 2025/26 A2B scheme are open until 13 November 2025 for Medicine and Dentistry and 12 February 2026 fir all other applicants. Completing the programme will bring you a range of benefits including an alternative offer and funding. We encourage you to explore our programme information and eligibility and consider applying.

Benefits of taking part in the programme

Once you complete A2B successfully, you will receive two offers from the University of Birmingham, the standard offer and a <u>Pathways to Birmingham offer</u>.

The Pathways to Birmingham offer is typically a reduction of up to two A level grades (e.g. BBB rather than AAB).

As well as the Pathways to Birmingham offer, you will also benefit from:

- Financial support
- •Continued support and guidance from an experienced and dedicated A2B team
- •Preparation for the transition from school to university study
- •The opportunity to make new friends at a special induction event before you start university
- •Becoming a Birmingham Scholar upon starting university
- •Practice interviews for courses where relevant (Medicine, Dentistry, Social Work, Nursing, and Physiotherapy)



Routes to the Professions

Routes to the Professions (R2P) is for Year 12 students looking to get a real insight into university study.

The programme gives you tailored support throughout the university application process. It focuses on courses and careers in Dentistry, Engineering, Law, Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy, Physiotherapy, and Social Work.

Applying to R2P

Applications for R2P 2026 are now open and are expected to close on 3 November 2025.

You must meet specific academic criteria to be eligible for this programme, so please read the information below before submitting an application.

Eligibility criteria

R2P is suitable for Year 12 students who have a strong commitment to study at the University of Birmingham and who are studying relevant qualifications for accessing degree programmes here.

To take part in the R2P programme in 2026 you must:

- •Be currently in Year 12 (and have not taken a gap year)
- •Be attending a Pathways to Birmingham partner school in the wider West Midlands area
- •Meet the <u>Pathways to Birmingham criteria</u> and the academic criteria for your stream.


Opportunities to explore health and healthcare careers through Volunteering for Health
