About Richard Bishop Challoner

Richard Challoner was born September 29th 1691 in Sussex and died January 12th 1781. A large part of who he was, encompasses life-long-learning. Before becoming Bishop, he was a professor of theology. He devoted his time to the love of learning and had great academic success.

He was described as being gentle, cheerful, generous and able to instil confidence in others. Today, we continue to live out his love for learning and give glory to God through acts of service.



Relationships and Sex Education

The Governing Body of Bishop Challoner acknowledges its statutory duty to provide Sex Education for all pupils (Education & Employment Act 1993). It is guided by the DfE 'Relationships and Sex Education' and by the Catholic Education Service.

This programme offers a coherent understanding of the gift of sexuality based on the dignity of the human person in the context of Church Teaching. It builds upon work covered at Key Stage One and Two in primary school. Our provider is Ten:Ten-Life to the Full, a company rooted in Catholic values and recommended by the Birmingham Diocesan Directive.

Prayer and Worship

Prayer and Worship are central to our School tradition and an essential part of pupil's development. Mass is celebrated weekly in our school chapel. In addition, the Sacrament of Reconciliation and other non-sacramental liturgies occur throughout the year. Pupils are encouraged to offer their personal skills and gifts, in a spirit of sharing and prayer, in the preparation of all liturgies, form time and school assemblies. Our community prays together and continues to give glory to God through service.

Further opportunities for spiritual development are available in Days of Reflection, for example Alton Castle, Soli House, School Retreats, Residential Experiences, and Pilgrimages to Lourdes.

Chaplaincy

Our school Chaplain, is available to support the personal and spiritual needs of the school community. He is assisted by our Spiritual Life Coordinator and Lay Chaplain.

Spiritual Development of Students

The aim of the Religious Education programme is to support the work of the home and the parish; developing and nourishing growth and faith and a personal relationship with Jesus Christ for all pupils. Pupils are presented with the teachings of Jesus Christ and His Church and are challenged to grow in understanding of truth, and in attitudes with regard to God, self, other people and the world in which they live. We encourage all pupils to seek, know and

encounter Him in their lives and offer opportunities throughout this journey. Dedication to high quality teaching and opportunities for pupils to grow as children of God are at the heart of our learning journey.

Together with our schools commitment to learning we promote the spiritual, moral, social, cultural, mental and physical development of students.
