Key Topics

2. The Nature of the Bible- Old and New Testament, How we use a Bible, Inspiration
3. Holy Books- Torah/TaNaKh and Bible, Language(s) of the holy books
4. Magisterium- what it is and an example
5. Prayer and how to use scripture in prayer
6. Understanding the Gospel - Lindisfarne

Skills

- A. Understand – Keywords- their definitions, examples. Key concepts – what a belief is.
- B. Discern- recognise and describe different beliefs.
- C. Respond- include evidence for the beliefs, memorisation and use of sources of wisdom such as the Bible or the Pope
 - defending one position and ability to show alternative views

Tips

- i. Memorise key Sources of Wisdom and Authority (SoWa)
- ii. Practice writing paragraphs that use SoWa to defend beliefs/teachings
- iii. Review the 10 topics from the list above
 - a. make bullet points on each (think 5W's, who, what, when, where, why, how)
 - b. Write a summary on each topic from the list
- iv. Make a revision resource that you like (mind map, cue cards, podcast etc)
