


Year 6 to 7 Geography

Key Stage 3 Geography Core Knowledge – September 2020

Having good basic geographical knowledge will help you understand more of the difficult topics and concepts that we will learn about in Geography lessons.

Year Group	Question	Answers
7	What are the 7 continents of the world?	The seven continents of the world are Antarctica, Africa, Asia, Australasia, Europe, North America and South America
	What is the European Union?	The European Union is a group of 28 countries whose governments work together politically and economically. The countries are predominantly in Europe.
	What countries make up the UK?	The countries that make up the UK are: England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
	Who is the Prime Minister of the UK?	Boris Johnson is the Prime Minister of the UK.
	What is the capital of England, N. Ireland, Wales, Scotland?	The capital of England is London, N. Ireland is Belfast, Wales is Cardiff and Scotland is Edinburgh.
	What is human geography the study of?	Human Geography is the study of how human activity affects or is influenced by the Earth's surface.
	What is physical geography the study of?	Physical Geography is the study of the natural processes of the earth such as climate and plate tectonics.
	Where Birmingham is on a map?	Birmingham is located in the centre of the West Midlands in England.
	What is the longest river in the UK?	The longest river in the UK is the River Severn.
	What is the tallest mountain in the UK?	The tallest mountain in the UK is Ben Nevis which is located in Scotland.
	What is flooding?	A flood is an overflow of water from a river that submerges land that is usually dry.

What is a HIC?	HIC stands for High Income Country and is a country with a strong economy.
What is a LIC?	LIC stands for Low Income Country and is a country with a poorer economy.
What is development?	Development is a process that creates growth, progress and positive change in the economy, environment and demography of a country.
How can development be measured?	Development can be measured using development indicators. These measures take into consideration both economic and social factors.
What is weather?	Weather is the state of the atmosphere at any given time, it describes the changes in conditions over short periods of time.
What is climate?	Climate is the average conditions you would expect for an area or a season over a period of time.
Where is the Middle East on a map?	The Middle East is a geographical region located mainly in western Asia but also in parts of northern Africa and south eastern Europe.
Where is China on a map?	China is located in the east of Asia along the Pacific Ocean and it is bordered by 16 countries. China is to the south of Mongolia.
What is the capital of China?	The capital of China is Beijing.
What does rural mean?	A rural area or the countryside is an area that is located outside of towns and cities.
What does urban mean?	An urban area is a built up area often a town or a city.
What is an ecosystem?	An ecosystem is all the plants and animals that live in a particular area together with the environment.
