Daily Prayer and Reflections

As it is the Feast of the Annunciation, today we reflect on the Yes that Mary said when she accepted to give Birth to the Baby Jesus and the trust in God to have that openness to accepting God in to this moment.

Pope Francis acknowledges the significance of Mary's Yes by saying

"Mary first conceived Jesus in faith and then in the flesh, when she said "yes" to the message God gave her through the angel. What does this mean? It means that God did not want to become man by bypassing our freedom; he wanted to pass through Mary's free assent, through her "yes." He asked her: "Are you prepared to do this?" And she replied: "Yes."

But what took place most singularly in the Virgin Mary also takes place within us, spiritually, when we receive the word of God with a good and sincere heart and put it into practice. It is as if God takes flesh within us; he comes to dwell in us, for he dwells in all who love him and keep his word. It is not easy to understand this, but really, it is easy to feel it in our heart."

<u>Today's Prayer:</u>

Lord.

I am unsure of the plans you have for me today. But I do know that You are my Rock and my Fortress. You are my Shield and my Strong Tower. I pray for strength to rely on you throughout the day. Help me walk by Your truth and not my feelings. Help me to embrace anything that comes my way as an opportunity to see You at work and as an opportunity to point others to You! Even if I fail today and fall short, you pick me back up and guide me.

In todays Gospel we hear of the annunciation and the joy of faith that Mary had to say Yes to God with an open heart.

'I am the handmaid of the Lord'

"The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you' the angel answered 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too: your kinswoman Elizabeth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month, for nothing is

impossible to God.' I am the handmaid of the Lord,' said Mary 'let what you have said be done to me.' And the angel left her."

In todays gospel reading, we read the verse "I am the handmaid of the Lord" which is this half terms scripture verse for the year of the God who Speaks. This really encourages us to listen to the word of God with an open mind and to trust in His plan for each of us. Mary knew that accepting giving birth to Jesus would come with its repercussions as she was betrothed to Joseph but said Yes anyway. In our life, we may be caught up in the day to day business to take that opportunity to listen to Gods Voice speaking in to our life but I challenge you to take 5 minutes to sit with no distractions and take a time of prayer.
