

Procedures During Year 12 Please see Handbook

- The student/parent/carer handbook can be found on our website

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Safeguarding

- ID lanyards must be worn at all times
- Sensible precautions should be taken to ensure personal safety off site
- Students receive an annual online safety assembly
- If a student is struggling with anxiety or other mental health concerns they should speak to one of the members of the Sixth Form Team who may refer them to our school Mental Health Team.
- Students must first report to First Aid if unwell at college
- Facemasks must be worn for lesson transition and in the common room (when not eating or drinking)



The 16-19 Bursary

- This is a limited amount of money that the college receives to support students who otherwise might struggle to stay on full time education.
- If your circumstances happen to change later in the year please speak, Mrs
 Nutt or Miss Reynolds to discuss late access to the bursary fund.

The College will:

- Monitor students' attendance
- •Withhold payments if the terms of the Learning Agreement are not met



Independent Learning

- The minimum expectation is that students should be doing about 5 hours per subject per week in addition to lessons
- ie. Around 15 extra hours of study per week or 3 hours per weekday.
- There are additional facilities for independent study in College
- Some study must be taking place at home



What can you do to help?

Encourage:

- Good study habits
- Early research (courses, universities, open days, types of apprenticeship, school leaver programmes) – making use of "unifrog" (details are covered later in this presentation)
- Involvement in activities (voluntary work, sports, etc.) for personal development and to strengthen applications next year

Discourage:

Heavy part-time work commitments



Online and Distanced Learning

- Students have access to 2 online platforms, Class Charts and Microsoft Teams, which subject teachers use to deliver work online. These are already set up and currently in use to provide resources and set work. In the event of a need for distanced learning, students will use these platforms to continue with their studies.
- Parents should also have received their own code to access the Class Charts app.



Student Services in Year 12




Careers Library

- Save unlimited shortlists to refer back to later








Special Opportunities


- Includes £5 million-worth of grants, bursaries, scholarships, contextual offers and extracurricular activities
