- Additional facilities for independent study are provided in our year 13 study centre
- There is a dress code



DRESS CODE

There is no uniform for Sixth Form students, but the expectation is that they conform to a style of dress we call 'modest casual'. This may be different to a student's interpretation of "casual". The Sixth Form dress code reflects the fact that this is a working environment and that our students are role models for the rest of the college. Student dress must be appropriate for an environment of serious study.

The following items are **NOT appropriate:**

- Clothes that reveal bare backs, midriff or plunging necklines
- Strapless tops
- Clothes that reveal upper thighs (unless worn with thick leggings)
- Clothes with offensive slogans
- Shorts above the knee
- Ripped Jeans
- Jogging/tracksuit bottoms or PE shorts
- Leggings, unless worn with a dress/tunic
- Headwear, except that worn for religious reasons

If a student needs to be reminded of the dress code they can expect to be sent home to get changed



Absences

Safeguarding

It is advisable for students to start looking now to get an idea of what is out there.



What students should have done by now

- First complete draft of their personal statement, on Unifrog
 - Registered for UCAS and completed most of the application

ONLY 7 full weeks to complete their application

- Decide if they definitely want to go to university
 - Decide on course
 - Decide on which universities
 - Finalise Personal Statement
 - Finish their application
 - Submit it to us



What happens when they submit their application to us?

- We read over and check their whole application
- Make sure they haven't missed anything or made any mistakes
- Do a final check over their Personal Statement
- Write a detailed reference
- Add on predicted grades
- Approve their application and send it to UCAS



Next Steps

- Talk from University of Birmingham on Monday
- Workshops to complete their Education section on UCAS
- Send their Personal Statement to their Form Tutor on Unifrog if they are ready for someone to read it
- If they are not where they should be, act now, or ask for help!
- If they have questions or concerns, see Miss Darby or Mrs Colgan in the 6th Form Office



Public Exams

- Good attendance and adequate progress required
- Students may be asked to pay for exam entry if not the case
- If there is a need for special examination arrangements (extra time, use of a laptop etc.) this **cannot** be made just prior to the examination period.
- If issues occur that impact on a student's ability to prepare, in the run up to public examinations, the College must be informed, so that special consideration can be requested from the examination boards. Written evidence may be required.


