Pre-loved Uniform

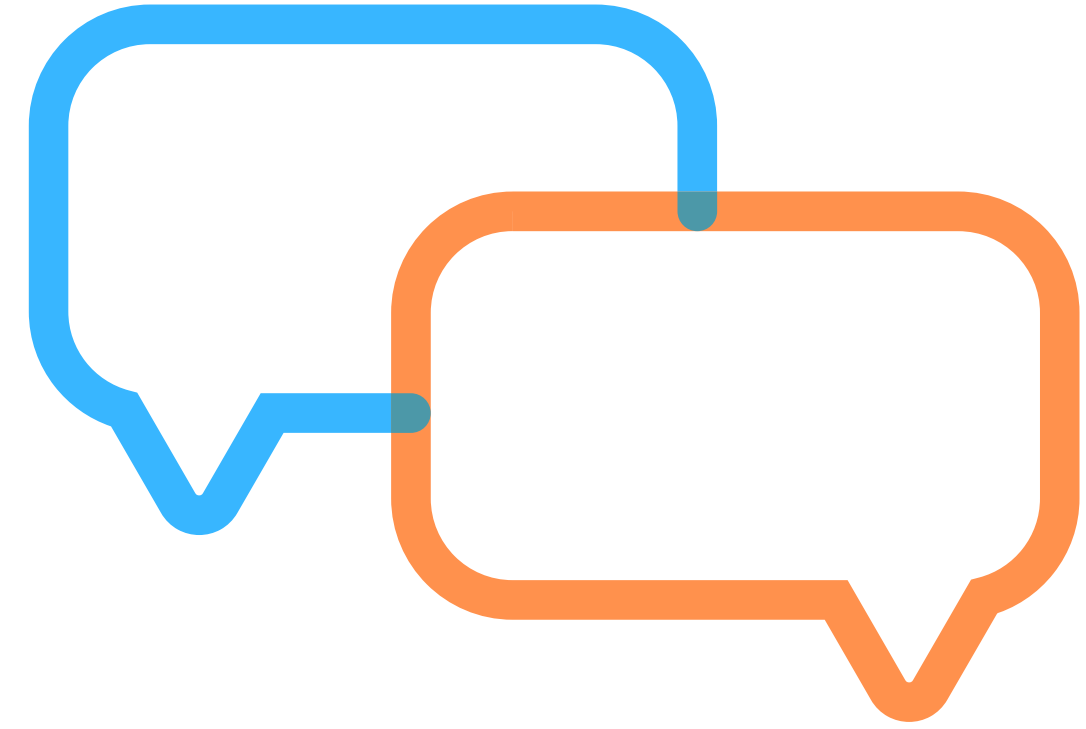
