

GROUND FLOOR



You will have the chance to make new friends, become involved in new activities by taking part in extra-curricular clubs and events.


It is important that you follow our Mission statement and the student responsibilities to ensure that we all get on as a happy community.

Behaviour for Learning and Standards



In order for all students to be able to fully engage with learning inside the classroom we insist that students:-

Do not call out

Do not talk when the teacher is addressing the whole class

Follow all instructions at the first time of asking



1. Have good attendance and punctuality

- 2. Follow instructions given by adults
- 3. Be polite and show consideration, care and respect for others
- 4. Respect the right of everyone to engage with teaching and learning
- 5. Respect the environment, school property and the property of others
- 6. Abide by the school dress code and come to school with the correct equipment

7. Do not bring valuable items into school

Sanctions will be applied when either BC Basics or BC 7 rules/standards are not met.

MOBILE PHONES

Many of you will have mobile phones which are useful so that parents can get in touch with you before and after school. In school however, it is important that these devices are kept safely in your bag or blazer pocket and are switched off during the school day.

The school has a strict mobile phone policy for visitors and staff and permission has to be granted for photographs to be taken of students.
