#### **School Sanctions**

There has been some confusion amongst students with regard to the issuing of sanctions for poor behaviour. We are aware that the vast majority of Year 8 students behave impeccably around the school site and regularly accrue positive feedback on Class Charts. The information below is in relation to Head of Year detentions, which are detentions led by myself or Miss Crutchley.

Head of Year detentions are issued for two negative logs that have not already been actioned by relevant staff. For instance, if a student had a negative log in one subject and also had a detention from that member of staff, it would not count toward the two weekly logs. Similarly, logs related to punctuality would not contribute because a sanction is automatically issued.

Occasionally, a student will receive more than one detention due to take place on the same day. In this instance, one of those detentions is likely to be moved to another day. Any further information about a positive or negative log can be ascertained from relevant staff or if necessary, from myself or Miss Crutchley. We wholly appreciate your continued support of our high standards.

## **Challoner Champion**

During the course of this academic year, our whole-school focus is still on the Year of Character. This focus is based on the recognition that the opportunities we provide for students to display virtue will inevitably lead to the greater development of their character.

#### **Black Country Museum**

In March, the History Department offered Year 8 students an invaluable opportunity to visit the Black Country Museum in Dudley to learn about Birmingham's industrial past. The visit involved a day at the museum, supported by a tour guide who focused on the lives and experiences of people who lived during the period.

Part of the day was interactive, allowing students to participate in a 19th century school lesson and to watch a show on the dangers of coal mining. The trip was a huge success, serving to support children in their studies of the Industrial Revolution; a topic which they explored in their lessons prior to the trip and in their understanding of the region.

There have been two excellent sporting trips since our last Newsletter: the Year 8 and 9 Ski Trip, and KS3 Boys Football Trip to Porto. #### **Summer Uniform Standards**

From Monday 5th June 2023, in the event of warm weather it will not be compulsory for students to wear a blazer, they will be able to wear just a shirt and tie. If a second layer is required, it must be a blazer and not any other item such as a hoody or outdoor coat.

There is no requirement to purchase any additional uniform items.

Students will be permitted to wear skin tone or black tights.

All other uniform requirements will remain unchanged.

Students are reminded that black leather school shoes should be worn and that trainers/trainer style shoes are forbidden. Please note that school shoes must be kept completely black and boots of any kind are not allowed.

In order to complement the smart school uniform we insist that students' hair is smart in appearance and that students do not have shaved/razored hair styles or lines/patterns shaved into the hair. Extreme changes of hair colour are also not permitted. Headscarves must be black. Braids are allowed. The final decision as to whether a particular haircut/style is appropriate is at the discretion of senior staff.

Make up, nail varnish and jewellery are not permitted with the exception of one pair of plain stud earrings which may be worn.

Please note that lycra or stretchy skirts are not allowed to be worn. Students found to be wearing an inappropriate item of uniform may be asked to change this or in some cases parents/carers will be contacted and requested to bring replacement uniform to school.

We appreciate your support in ensuring that standards of uniform and appearance are maintained.

#### **Reporting Student Absence**

All students are required to attend school/college on time every day. If for any reason your child is unable to attend, please ensure that the school attendance policy is followed, and their absence is reported before the START of the school day (8.40am) and on each day of absence. Please provide a reason for their absence and the likely length of absence, if known.

If your child is in Year 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 please call 0121 444 4161 and select OPTION 1.

If you receive a text message or phone call from school/college because you have not reported your child's absence, please contact us on the most appropriate number as detailed above as soon as you can. Please do not email staff to report an absence, this is not the procedure and your messages may be missed.

#### Skirts

From September 2023 only a black pleated skirt will be permitted to be worn as part of school uniform. Pleated skirts are available from Clive Mark as well as other school uniform retailers. To avoid any additional expense for families, if your child has a straight skirt (not stretchy, lycra or tight fitting) that still fits, this can be worn during the first half term, from October half term onwards, all skirts will need to be pleated of knee to mid calf worn on the waist not the hips (maximum of 5cm above the knee).

#### Allergy Management

Bishop Challoner Catholic College aims to minimise the risk to students and staff with allergies, including those who are allergic to nuts.

It is vital that staff and parents/carers and students adhere to the Allergy Management policy, as we have both students and staff in school who suffer from allergies, including nut allergies.

Persons with allergies, including a nut allergy can suffer lifethreatening consequences if they come into contact with allergens, including nuts, either through ingestion or through touch. Parents/carers, students and staff must not bring or send, any food into school either for packed lunches or for snacks/ treats with nuts in (including sesame seeds). For example, the following items should not be brought into school:

- · Packs of nuts
- · Peanut butter sandwiches
- · Fruit and cereal bars that contain nuts
- · Chocolate bars or sweets that contain nuts
- · Cakes or biscuits made with nuts
- · Nutella
- · Muesli bars

Care should be taken when exchanging gifts, in particular at Easter, Christmas and birthdays. We appreciate your support with this important matter.
