Students have demonstrated great attitudes towards learning about people with different needs to their own, and they have very much enjoyed spending time with the students.

Enrichment

Year 9 have been involved in activities such as dance lessons, life skills classes, art lessons and spending time with students during break time. We have several students that would now like to attend Fox Hollies as their year 10 work experience because they have been inspired by the caring nature of the school and have valued developing their different communication skills. In March, a few students will continue to develop their experiences by attending a residential alongside our Fox Hollies' friends; the aim is for students to spend time together learning from one another and developing the leadership skills required to support someone of different needs. Charity





Big Physics Quiz

Out of approximately fifty other schools in the West Midlands, Year 9 students represented Challoner in the Big Physics Quiz hosted by the Physics and Astronomy department of the University of Birmingham. With no additional training, our students ranked 11th when competing competitively, narrowly missing out to local grammar schools. They also experienced a keynote lecture by Dr Maria Pavlidou: what an opportunity to heighten our aspirations.

Football

Congratulations to the Boys football team. They have won their quarter final game against Wheelers Lane 3-1. This was an excellent performance and they will now compete in the semi-finals of the Birmingham Cup. Year 9, as always, have excelled in sports and many attend multiple after/before school clubs. Book Club

Book club's diligent members have also been improving and growing in confidence in their reading. Reading is proven to help students achieve in all subjects and must be encouraged for students to succeed in their future endeavours. Coming up to the Year 9 Pathways, we will support and stretch all students in terms of their reading needs.

Year 9 Pathways

Next half term, students must stretch and challenge themselves as we approach a pivotal time in their educational careers. Leading up to the Pathways' Evening on 7th March, students will be receiving myriad assemblies about their GCSE choices. We encourage all students to discuss their ideas both at home and with their teachers in preparation for such big decisions. T2 Assessments

With the T2 assessments around Easter, Year 9 are introducing a drop in Breakfast revision club on two mornings a week. On Mondays, these will take place in E1 with Mrs Hodges and on Wednesday, they will occur in C2 with Ms Beard. Students are welcome from 8:00am until form for help and a quiet space to revise. These assessments, which should not worry students, should demonstrate their knowledge and all the skills they have learnt. Revision is vital for their success and we will support them during this time.

Schoolcomms

As you are aware we operate a cashless catering system and Schoolcomms is the only system to make payments for your child's school dinners and school trips. Uniform and Appearance

Students are required to wear the standard uniform of blazer, tie, white/blue shirt with black straight leg school trousers (not skinny or boot cut) or girls can wear a knee length black school skirt. Girls are also reminded that if they choose to wear a skirt, then they should wear plain, black, opaque tights. Students are reminded that black leather school shoes should be worn and that trainers/trainer style shoes are forbidden.

Please note that school shoes must be kept completely black. There are a number of styles, particularly for girls, currently in fashion with wood style soles. These are not suitable for school. School shoes should also be leather and not patent.

In order to complement the smart school uniform we insist that students' hair is smart in appearance and that students do not have shaved/razored hair styles or lines/patterns shaved into the hair. Extreme changes of hair colour are also not permitted. The final decision as to whether a particular haircut/style is appropriate is at the discretion of senior staff.

Make up, nail varnish and jewellery are not permitted with the exception of one pair of plain gold stud earrings which may be worn by girls.

I know that you will, as always, support us in maintaining the smart appearance of your children and high standards of discipline, so that our focus in school can be on educational achievement.

Mobile Phones/Smart Watches

Mobile phones and smart watches are not allowed to be used in school. Students are only permitted to use their mobile phone or smart watch from 3.10pm onwards once on the playground/exit gates. Students found with a mobile phone/smart watch during lessons and around the school will have them confiscated and they will be returned at the discretion of senior staff/Heads of Year. In more persistent cases, phones may only be returned to parents/carers.

Attendance and Punctuality

- Year 9- 94%
- Whole school- 95%

The whole school attendance target is an aspirational 97% and we would hope that we can work towards achieving this as a year group by the end of the academic year.

If your child is absent from school, a notification phone call needs to be made to the school on the first day of the absence and every subsequent day they are absent too. Upon return to school, a written note needs to be handed in to their form tutor, stating the reason for absence. Please encourage your child to be at school by 8.30am to instil the important life skill of good punctuality.
