Year 8 T1 assessments

Dear Parents/Carers,

Following the postponement of the T1 assessments earlier in the academic year, students will now have assessments in their core subjects of Maths, English, Science, RE, History and Geography. The results of these assessments alongside classwork may lead to a change of setting. For all assessments students have been given revision material and two weeks notice of assessment dates. The below is a summary of the content being assessed in each subject.

Year 8 Science

The assessment consists of two papers. Paper 1 assesses content across the three areas of science and is an hour. Paper 2 is 20 minutes long and assesses practical skills and analysis of data. The assessments are beginning week beginning of 17th May.

Geography

Will take place: The week commencing Monday 24th May

Topic: Brazil and Geographical Skills

Revision Material: Students will be given with a revision checklist for exam, their class booklets and will make revision material ahead of the assessments in the coming weeks such as flash cards, mind maps and revision PowerPoints.

History

The History T1 will take place in the first week back after the half-term (7th - 11th of June)

The subject of the assessment will be the Industrial Revolution and whether it was a time of progress for the people of Britain and its Empire. This will include topics previously studied such as:

- Living conditions
- Working conditions in cities and the countryside
- Politics and the rights to vote
- Women and society in the 1800s
- Britain's Empire Ireland and the West Indies.
- Laissez Faire attitudes and progressive PMs

Revision materials/resources will be put on Class Charts and students will have some revision lessons with their teacher before they sit the assessment.

Religious Studies

The Y8 RS assessment is focusing on our unit called ' Morality; right vs wrong'.

- b) Write in full paragraphs (P.E.E.L) using evidence to support points.
