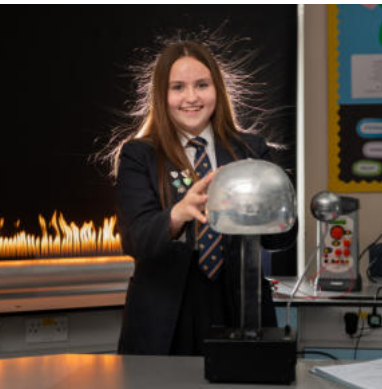

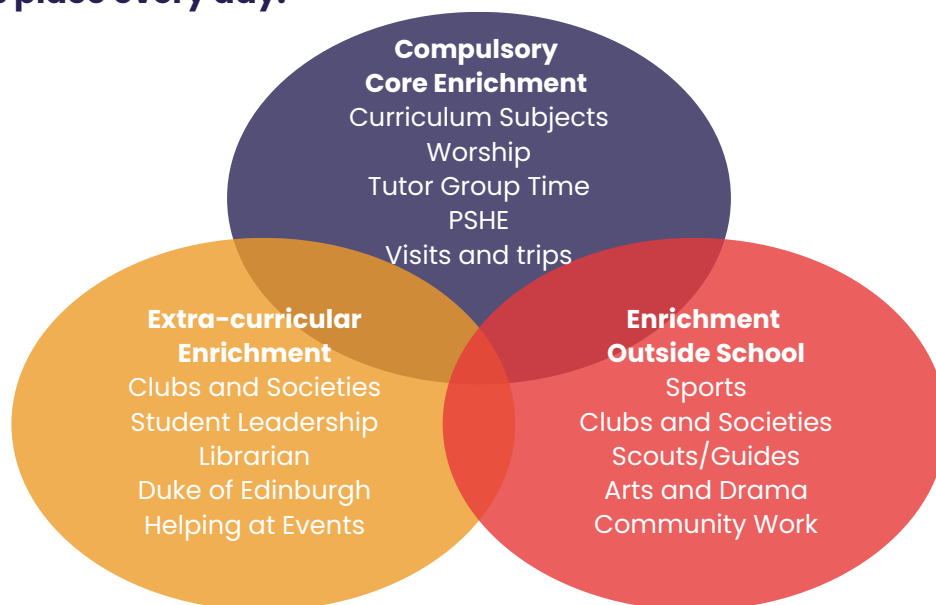
WHAT IS ENRICHMENT?

Enrichment is defined as *'the action of improving or enhancing the quality or value of something'*. At Bishop Rawstone we offer a rich and varied range of enrichment activities which provides students with additional opportunities for personal growth, self-development and achievement, as well as improved self-esteem.

There are three strands to enrichment at Bishop Rawstone:

1. Compulsory Core Enrichment that takes place at school alongside the subjects all students study.
2. Extra-curricular Enrichment are activities that are offered by the school that students choose to do outside of normal classroom lessons.
3. Enrichment Outside School are activities that students choose to do in their own time.

These strands of enrichment can be thought of as a 'web' of interconnected experiences and skills which develop an individual over time. **Enrichment is for all and it takes place every day.**



How Do I Use My Personal Enrichment Passport? (PEP)

1. Use your PEP to learn more about the school values and how you can make the most out all the opportunities that are available to you.
2. Each year make pledges - commitments or undertakings to improve an area of your life - and then reflect back on your achievements at the end of the year.
3. At the back of the PEP, record everything you have done. This can be used to help you write applications, personal statements, CVs and references in the future.

PEACE



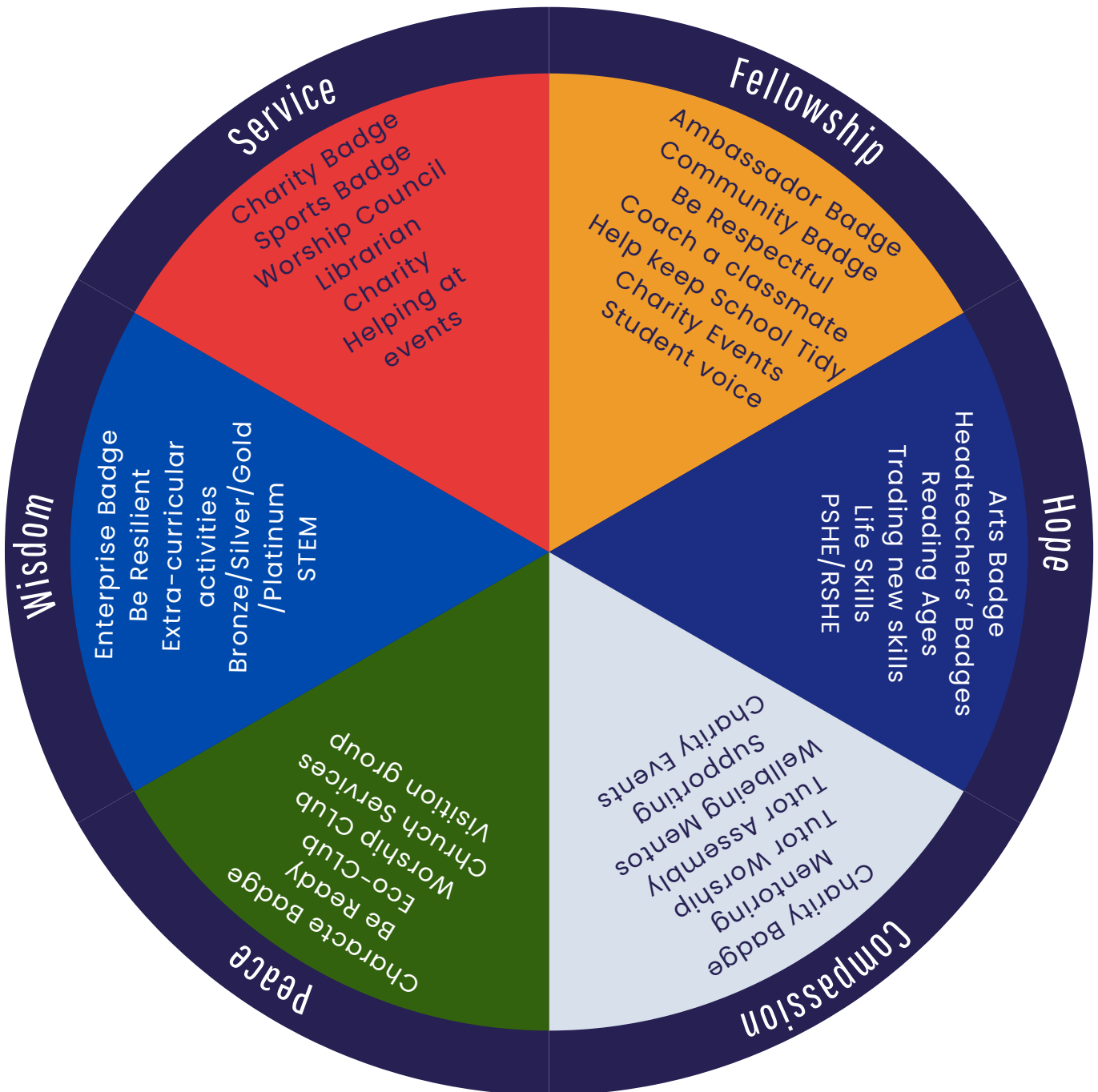
We work to foster peace over aggression

WHAT ARE POINTS AND REWARDS?

We recognise positive behaviour and reward hard work, attitude, effort, commitment and achievements using our points and rewards system. Points are cumulative and you can challenge yourself to achieve a bronze, silver, gold or platinum badge when you reach the required number of points.

How Can I Earn Rewards?

If you earn enough points you may be eligible to attend reward breakfasts, lunches or some of the other celebration events that we run every half-term. An example of some events we have run before are below – further details will be provided by your Head of Year, or keep an eye on the hall noticeboards.

AUTUMN TERM

October

- **Reward breakfasts** for the top 30 point scorers in each year

December

- **Chocolates** for the top 30 points scorers in each year and top 15 boys and 15 girls also get a letter home.
- Postcard draw in assembly 3 x **£10 gift vouchers** given per year.
- Points draw in assembly 8 x **£10 gift vouchers** per year; top 80 point scorers from each year will be entered into a draw



SPRING TERM

February

- **Reward breakfasts** for the top 30 point scorers in each year since Christmas.

March

- **Chocolates** for students who have shown brilliant behaviour.
- Postcard draw in assembly 3 x **£10 gift vouchers** given per year.
- Points Draw in assembly 8 x **£10 gift vouchers** per year; top 40 point scorers from each year will be entered into a draw.

SUMMER TERM

May

- Letter and **free lunch voucher** to be given to 30 students in each year group.

July

- **Celebration lunches** for 30 students in each year.
- Postcard-draw in assembly 3 x **£10 gift vouchers** given per year.
- Points draw in assembly 8 x **£10 gift vouchers** per year; top 20 point scorers from each year will be entered into a draw.



WHAT ARE THE BISHOP'S AWARDS?

Our awards programme rewards achievements in school and celebrates accomplishments outside of the usual school activities. It is open to all students, regardless of academic ability.

HEADTEACHER'S AWARD

The highest level award which provides students with an extra challenge!

This badge is presented to students who have received multiple 'B' for Bishops badges, competed nationally, or have done something exceptional (at the Headteacher's discretion)
