A Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Our Christian community heads into the Christmas holidays enveloped not in the joy of the season as is usual at this time of year, but a deep sadness at the passing of Lauren Menzies from Year 9, who died away last week. It is hard to imagine the pain that is being felt by her family at this time as they try to deal with the dreadful loss of their lovely daughter and sister, taken from them all too soon. We will remember her as a bright, bubbly and hard-working student, who had a real strong talent for drama and dance. Her loss is particularly acute for her close friends, the students in her tutor group, in her year group, for the students of Year 7 who know Rafe, and all the staff who have taught Lauren over the past two years or so. Lauren's funeral will be on Christmas Eve 12.30 at Charnock Richard Crematorium and the family have said they do not want flowers or cards at the funeral, instead asking for donations to Alder Hey Hospital in Liverpool if anyone wishes to do so: www.justgiving.com/fundraising/l-menzies06.

The strength of our Christian community comes to the fore at times like this and with the support of our Chaplains we had a series of assemblies for the different year groups in school, and Father Andrew led the staff in a short service of remembrance, thanks and prayer before the start of the school day after we had heard the terrible news. The Chaplains were in school all day to support our students and we also had counselling support from Blackburn Diocese. The level of respect and love for Lauren from so many students and staff in school was deeply moving. At times like this you remember not only the suffering that others have to endure, whether we know them or not, but also how a school and all of its community is built on relationships and the values that make those strong relationships possible, so that we are able to move forward with hope.

Psalm 46:1-3 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging."

The staff and governors of the school recognise the outstanding character, work ethic and values of our students and they are the key element of our Christian community, providing us with our motivation and purpose. In August, we welcomed our new cohort of Year 7 students to Bishop Rawstorne and it is wonderful each year to welcome all these new arrivals, whilst our Year 11s prepare for their GCSEs in May and June 2020. New beginnings and moving onto the next challenge remain integral within any school and are part of our blessed cycle, for which we are truly grateful.

The support of you, our parents, in all that we do is invaluable and cannot be overstated. Our staff is dedicated and committed to enhancing outcomes for all of our students and that works best in partnership with you. On behalf of the Governing Body and all of the staff here, I would like to wish you and your families a happy, restful and peaceful Christmas.
