Adventure & Fantasy:



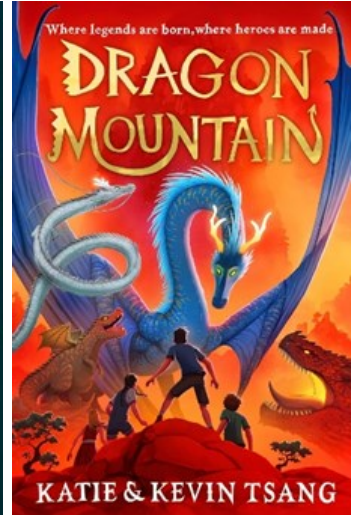
An ode to movies, to the power of imagination, and to being the hero of your own story.



This book brings magic and Greek mythology together.

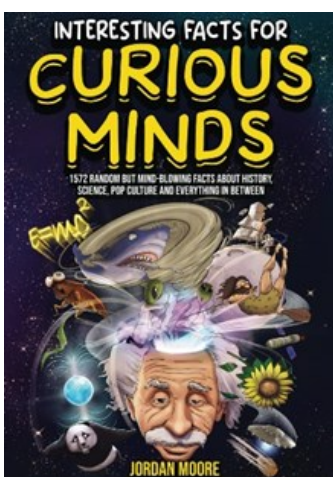


A fun adventure story with a timelessness to it. Larger than life characters, lots of twists and action.

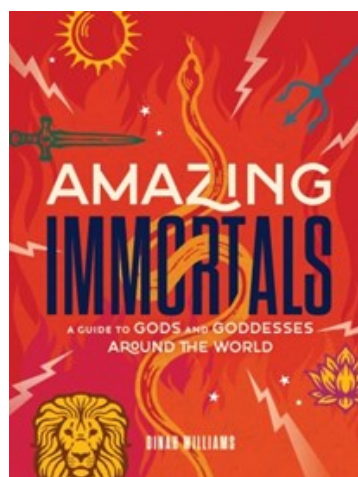
